SUMMARY:

House Bill 4883 would add a new section to the Michigan Election Law that would prohibit political parties from requiring individuals elected as precinct delegates or selected as delegates to a state or national political party convention to pay dues to vote or otherwise participate at any county, state, or national party convention.

Proposed MCL 168.612a

FISCAL IMPACT:

The bill would have no fiscal impact on the state or local units of governments. Michigan political parties would incur an indeterminate decrease in revenue as a result of elected and selected party delegates not being required to pay dues to their respective parties.
