## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4828

A bill to amend 2005 PA 244, entitled "Deferred presentment service transactions act," by amending section 51 (MCL 487.2171).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 51. (1) The commissioner director may promulgate rules under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, to enforce and administer this act.
- 4 (2) By July 31, 2007, the commissioner March 31, 2022, and by
  5 each March 31 thereafter through March 31, 2028, the director shall
  6 submit a report to the standing committees of the senate and house
  7 of representatives concerned with regulatory reform banking and
  8 financial services issues that includes the following information:
- 9 (a) The number of persons engaged in the business of providing

- 3 the immediately preceding calendar year.
- 4 (b) A general report on the business of providing deferred

- 6 during the immediately preceding calendar year. The report shall
- 7 must include information about the number of licensees, the number
- 8 of customers, and the number and amount of transactions, and any
- 9 other financial information about deferred presentment service
- 10 transactions in this state requested by the legislature or
- 11 considered relevant by the commissioner.reported in the following
- 12 format:
- 13 (i) A summary of the deferred presentment service transaction
- 14 program fees received by the department.
- 15 (ii) Statewide statistics concerning transaction volumes by
- 16 month, transaction amounts, fees, and averages, active license
- 17 locations, the total number of customers of providers, and consumer
- 18 usage of repayment plans.
- 19 (iii) Statistics, reported by county or zip code, concerning
- 20 provider locations, identification of the county in which the zip
- 21 code is located, transaction volumes, total amount of advances,
- 22 total fees for advances, average advance amounts, average advance
- 23 fees, and the total number of licensee locations.
- 24 (c) The number of complaints filed with the department against
- 25 licensees and nonlicensees arising from transactions that took
- 26 place in this state for the immediately preceding calendar year.
- 27 (d) Any additional information that the director considers
- 28 relevant.
- 29 (3) Beginning March 31, 2022, and on March 31 of each year

- 1 thereafter through March 31, 2028, the department shall publish on
- 2 its website the report described in subsection (2).
- 3 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 4 after the date it is enacted into law.
