SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4876

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 677 (MCL 168.677), as amended by 2018 PA 120.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 677. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4),
- 2 a precinct election inspector must be a qualified and registered
- 3 elector of this state, must have a good reputation, and must have
- 4 sufficient education and clerical ability to perform the duties of
- 5 the office. A person An individual must not be appointed to a board
- 6 of election inspectors unless the person individual has filed an
- 7 application with a city or township clerk in that county where the
- 8 individual wishes to serve as election inspector.
- 9 (2) The application required under subsection (1) must be in

- 1 his or her own handwriting and must contain the applicant's name,
- 2 home address, ward and precinct registration if any, date of birth,
- 3 political party affiliation that is recognized by the secretary of
- 4 state, education, employment, and other experience qualifications.
- 5 The application must provide a certification that the applicant is
- 6 not a member or a known active advocate, as that term is defined in
- 7 section 674, of a political party other than the one-political
- 8 party entered on the application. The application must also include
- 9 an attestation signed by the applicant under penalty of perjury
- 10 that the information provided is true, complete, and accurate. The
- 11 form of the application under this section must be approved by the
- 12 state director of elections. The clerk shall maintain do all of the
- 13 following:
- 14 (a) Maintain a file of applications filed under this section
- 15 and make the applications available for public inspection at the
- 16 clerk's office during normal business hours.
- 17 (b) Provide to the chairperson of each precinct and absent
- 18 voter counting board in the city or township a list of the
- 19 individuals who are assigned to the precinct or absent voter
- 20 counting board as precinct election inspectors that certifies that
- 21 those individuals have a complete precinct election inspector
- 22 application on file, including the required political party
- 23 affiliation.
- 24 (c) Make the list described in subdivision (b) available for
- 25 public inspection.
- 26 (d) Provide to the chairperson of each political party
- 27 committee in the county in which the city or township is located a
- 28 certified list containing the political party affiliation for each
- 29 individual acting as a precinct election inspector in each precinct

1 and absent voter counting board in the city or township.

- 2 (3) A person An individual must not be knowingly appointed or permitted to act as a precinct election inspector if the person 3 individual or any member of his or her immediate family is a 4 5 candidate for nomination or election to any office at the election 6 or who has been convicted of a felony or election crime. A person 7 An individual must not be permitted to act as an a precinct 8 election inspector if he or she has failed to attend a school of 9 instruction or failed to take an examination as provided in section 10 683. This section does not prohibit the candidate for or delegate 11 to a political party convention from acting as an a precinct election inspector in a precinct other than the precinct in which 12 he or she resides. An election must not be invalidated merely 13 14 because of the violation of the provisions of this section.
- 15 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and 16 subject to subsection (5), a person an individual who is 16 or 17 years of age may be appointed to a board of election inspectors. 17 18 Before a person an individual may be appointed under this subsection, the first 3 members of the board required to be 19 20 appointed under section 672 must meet the requirements of subsections (1) to (3). A person An individual who is appointed 21 under this subsection must meet the requirements of subsections (1) 22 23 to (3) other than being a qualified and registered elector of this 24 state. A person An individual who is appointed under this 25 subsection is not eligible to be designated as chairperson of the board under section 674. 26
- (5) If a person an individual seeking appointment to a board
 of election inspectors under subsection (4) is attending a K-12
 school and if an election falls on a school day, the person shall

- 1 individual must provide to the clerk, along with the application
- 2 filed under subsections (1) and (2), a written document from his or
- 3 her school specifically acknowledging that person's individual's
- 4 application for appointment to the board of election inspectors and
- 5 specifically excusing that person individual from school on the
- 6 date of service, if the appointment is made.
