ENROLLED HOUSE BILL No. 4063

AN ACT to amend 1978 PA 90, entitled "An act to provide for the legal employment and protection of minors; to provide for the issuance and revocation of work permits; to provide for the regulation of hours and conditions of employment of minors; to prescribe powers and duties of the departments of labor and education; to provide for the enforcement of this act; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts," by amending section 2 (MCL 409.102), as amended by 1996 PA 438.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Sec. 2. As used in this act:

- (a) "Employ" means engage, permit, or allow to work.
- (b) "Employer" means a person, firm, or corporation that employs a minor, and includes the state or a political subdivision of the state, an agency or instrumentality of the state, and an agent of an employer.
 - (c) "Issuing officer" means any of the following:
- (i) The chief administrator of a school district, intermediate school district, public school academy, or nonpublic school, or a person authorized by that chief administrator in writing to act on his or her behalf.
- (ii) For a minor being educated under section 1561(3)(f) of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1561, the minor's parent or legal guardian.
- (d) "Issuing officer of the school district, intermediate school district, public school academy, or nonpublic school at which the minor is enrolled" includes a minor's parent or legal guardian if the minor is being educated under section 1561(3)(f) of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1561.
 - (e) "Minor" means a person under 18 years of age.
