HOUSE BILL NO. 4142

February 04, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Coleman and Filler and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 82105, 82114, 82118, and 82119 (MCL 324.82105, 324.82114, 324.82118, and 324.82119), sections 82105 and 82114 as amended by 2012 PA 28, section 82118 as amended by 2010 PA 371, and section 82119 as amended by 2005 PA 307.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 82105. (1) Before operating If a snowmobile requiring
- 2 registration is required under section 82103 to be registered in

- 1 this state, the owner shall apply for registration with the
- 2 department of state on forms provided by the department of state.
- 3 If the snowmobile was purchased from a retail dealer in this state,
- 4 application for initial registration shall be made with the dealer
- 5 at the point of sale. The dealer shall issue a temporary
- 6 registration permit in a form received from and approved by the
- 7 department of state. that The temporary registration permit is
- 8 valid for 15 days after the date of sale. Each retail dealer shall
- 9 submit applications for registrations and fees to the department of
- 10 state not less than once each week. The application shall include a
- 11 certification. The new owner shall sign the application or, if the
- 12 application is filed electronically, provide information requested
- 13 by the department of state to verify the new owner's identity. The
- 14 application shall also include the new owner's name and bona fide
- 15 residence address and the names and addresses of holders of any
- 16 security interest in the snowmobile and its accessories in the
- 17 order of priority. The application shall be accompanied by a fee of
- 18 \$30.00. Upon receipt of the application in approved form, the
- 19 department of state shall enter the application upon its records
- 20 and issue to the applicant a certificate of registration and decal.
- 21 The certificate of registration shall contain the number awarded to
- 22 the snowmobile, the name and address of the owner, other
- 23 information the department of state considers necessary, and τ
- 24 beginning July 1, 2009, the name and address of the holders of
- 25 secured interests. A person shall not operate a snowmobile that is
- 26 required to be registered in this state unless the person possesses
- 27 the certificate of registration in legible form. The person
- (2) The operator of a snowmobile shall make the certificate ofregistration available for inspection upon demand by a peace

officer. A person who violates this subsection is responsible for a state civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than \$150.00.

4 (3) $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$ If the secretary of state is not satisfied as to the 5 ownership of a snowmobile that is worth more than \$2,500.00, before registering the snowmobile and issuing a certificate of 6 7 registration, the secretary of state may require the applicant to 8 file a properly executed surety bond in a form prescribed by the 9 secretary of state and executed by the applicant and a company 10 authorized to conduct a surety business in this state. The bond 11 shall be in an amount equal to twice the value of the snowmobile as determined by the secretary of state and shall be conditioned to 12 13 indemnify or reimburse the secretary of state, any prior owner, and 14 any subsequent purchaser of the snowmobile and their successors in interest against any expense, loss, or damage, including reasonable 15 16 attorney fees, incurred as a result of the issuance of a certificate of registration for the snowmobile or any defect in the 17 18 right, title, or interest of the applicant in the snowmobile. An 19 interested person has a right of action to recover on the bond for 20 a breach of the conditions of the bond, but the aggregate liability 21 of the surety to all persons shall not exceed the amount of the 22 bond. The bond shall be returned at the end of 3 years, or before 3 23 years if when the snowmobile is no longer registered in this state 24 and the current valid certificate of registration is surrendered to 25 the secretary of state, whichever is earlier, unless the secretary 26 of state has received notification of the pendency of an action to 27 recover on the bond. If the secretary of state is not satisfied as to the ownership of a snowmobile that is worth \$2,500.00 or less, 28 29 the secretary of state shall require the applicant to certify that

- 1 the applicant is the owner of the snowmobile and entitled to
 2 register the snowmobile.
- 3 (4) (3)—The certificate of registration and registration decal 4 authorizes the operation of the snowmobile for a 3-year period that 5 begins on October 1 and expires on September 30 of the third year. 6 The certificate of registration and registration decal may be 7 renewed beginning July 1 of the expiration year by payment of a fee
- 8 of \$30.00. The registration decal shall be displayed as prescribed
- 9 by rule promulgated by the department of state.section 82113.
- 10 (5) (4)—The department of state may destroy a record of a 11 certificate of registration 7 years after expiration of the 12 certificate.
- 13 Sec. 82114. (1) The owner of a snowmobile shall notify the 14 department of state within 15 days if the snowmobile is destroyed, 15 or abandoned, or is sold, or if an interest in the snowmobile is 16 transferred either wholly or in part to another person, or if the 17 owner's address no longer conforms to the address has changed from 18 that appearing on the certificate of registration. The notice shall 19 consist of a surrender of the certificate of registration on which 20 the proper information shall be is noted on a place to be provided. 21 If the certificate of registration is surrendered because the 22 snowmobile was destroyed or abandoned, the department of state 23 shall cancel the certificate of registration and enter that fact 24 the destruction or abandonment in the records of the department of 25 state, and the number may be then reassigned. The department of 26 state may destroy the record of a surrendered certificate of 27 registration 10 years after its surrender.
- (2) If the certificate of registration is surrendered becauseof the owner's change of address, the department shall record the

- new address shall be recorded by the department of state and return
 to the owner a certificate of registration bearing that information
 shall be returned to the owner. the new address.
- 4 (3) The transferee of a snowmobile registered under this part, 5 within 15 days after acquiring the snowmobile, shall apply to the department of state for issuance of a new certificate of 6 registration for the snowmobile. , giving The application shall 7 8 include the previous registration number of the snowmobile and 9 proof of payment or satisfaction of any security interest shown on 10 the previous owner's certificate of registration or the department 11 of state's records. The application shall include a certification. 12 The new owner shall sign the application or, if the application is 13 filed electronically, provide information requested by the 14 department of state to verify the owner's identity. The application 15 shall also include the new owner's name and bona fide residence 16 address and the names and addresses of the holders of security interests in the snowmobile and its accessories in the order of 17 18 their priority. The application shall be accompanied by the fee 19 prescribed in section 82105. Upon receipt of the application and 20 fee, the department of state shall issue to the new owner a new certificate of registration for the snowmobile. to the new owner. 21 22 Unless the application is made and the fee paid within 15 days of transfer of ownership, the snowmobile is without certificate of 23 registration, and a person shall not operate the snowmobile until a 24 25 valid certificate of registration is issued.
- 26 (4) If a A person shall not operate a snowmobile if the
 27 certificate of registration is lost, mutilated, or illegible. , the
 28 owner of the snowmobile shall obtain a duplicate of the certificate
 29 of registration upon application and payment of a fee of \$5.00.A

- 1 person who violates this subsection is responsible for a state
- 2 civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more
- 3 than \$150.00.
- 4 (5) If a valid registration decal is lost, mutilated, or
- 5 illegible, the owner of the snowmobile may obtain a replacement
- 6 registration decal from the department of state, upon submission of
- 7 proof of registration and payment of a fee of \$5.00.
- 8 Sec. 82118. (1) In addition to registration of a snowmobile
- 9 under section 82105 or registration in another state or province,
- 10 except as otherwise provided in this section, a person who desires
- 11 to operate a snowmobile in this state shall purchase a Michigan
- 12 snowmobile trail permit sticker. The Michigan snowmobile trail
- 13 permit issued under this section shall be is valid for a period of
- 14 1 year which begins beginning on October 1 and ends ending on the
- 15 following September 30. The fee for the permit shall be is as
- 16 follows:
- 17 (a) For permits valid for the 1-year period beginning October
- 18 1, 2009 or October 1, 2010, \$35.00.
- 19 (b) For permits a permit valid for the 1-year period beginning
- 20 October 1, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, or 2015, \$45.00.
- 21 (b) (c) For permits a permit valid for the 1-year period
- 22 beginning October 1, 2016 and every fifth year thereafter, the
- 23 state treasurer shall adjust the current permit fee by an amount
- 24 determined by the state treasurer to reflect the cumulative
- 25 percentage change in the consumer price index Consumer Price Index
- 26 during the most recent 5-year period for which consumer price index
- 27 Consumer Price Index statistics are available, rounded to the
- 28 nearest dollar. A fee adjusted by the state treasurer under this
- 29 subdivision shall remain in effect for 5 years. As used in this

- 1 subdivision, "consumer price index" "Consumer Price Index" means
- 2 the most comprehensive index of consumer prices available for this
- 3 state from the bureau of labor statistics Bureau of Labor
- 4 Statistics of the United States department of labor. Department of
- 5 Labor.
- 6 (2) Revenue from the trail permit fee shall be allocated as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) 50 cents shall be retained by the department for
- 9 administrative costs.
- 10 (b) \$1.00 shall be retained by the agent selling the permit.
- 11 (c) The balance shall be deposited in the recreational
- 12 snowmobile trail improvement subaccount.
- 13 (3) The department shall make the sale of trail permits
- 14 available on its website. For each trail permit sold through the
- 15 website, the amount otherwise credited to an agent under subsection
- 16 (2) shall instead be credited to the recreational snowmobile trail
- 17 improvement subaccount.
- 18 (4) The trail permit sticker shall be permanently affixed to
- 19 the snowmobile directly above or below the headlight of the
- 20 snowmobile.
- 21 (5) The department may contract with a person to act as an
- 22 agent for the purpose of issuing Michigan snowmobile trail permits.
- 23 The department shall sell the permits to agents in bulk. An agent
- 24 may obtain a refund from the department for any permits that are
- 25 not sold.
- 26 (6) An agent who uses or allows the use of a permit by anyone
- 27 except the snowmobile user to whom the permit is sold is guilty of
- 28 a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of \$50.00 for each instance of
- 29 such use or allowed use.

- 1 (7) The department of state may suspend a certificate of
 2 registration if the department of state determines that the
 3 required fee has not been paid and remains unpaid after reasonable
 4 notice or demand. In addition to the required fee, a \$10.00 penalty
 5 shall be assessed and collected against any person who tenders an
 6 insufficient check or draft in payment of the fee.
- 7 (8) A snowmobile used solely for transportation on the frozen
 8 surface of public waters for the purpose of ice fishing is exempt
 9 from the requirement of purchasing and displaying a snowmobile
 10 trail permit sticker under this section.
- (9) A person shall not charge a fee for a snowmobile trail
 permit in an amount that is greater than the fee printed on the
 face of the permit.
- 14 (10) To obtain a snowmobile trail permit, an applicant shall15 provide all information required on the permit application.
- 16 (11) A person who fails to secure a permit under this section 17 or who violates subsection (4) is responsible for a state civil 18 infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than 19 \$100.00.\$150.00.
- 20 (12) The department shall, by June 1 of each year, report to
 21 the members of the appropriate standing committees and
 22 appropriations subcommittees of the house and senate, a detailed
 23 expenditure plan pertaining to the additional funds generated by
 24 this act. The plan shall include information as to how funds were
 25 expended in the prior year.
- 26 (13) This section does not apply to a historic snowmobile27 registered under section 82105c.
- Sec. 82119. (1) A person shall not operate a snowmobile upon a public highway, land used as an airport or street, or on a public

- 1 or private parking lot not specifically designated for the use of
- 2 snowmobiles except under the following conditions and
- 3 circumstances:
- 4 (a) Subject to subsection (2), a snowmobile may be operated on
- 5 the right-of-way of a public highway, except a limited access
- 6 highway, if it is operated at the extreme right of the open portion
- 7 of the right-of-way and with the flow of traffic on the highway.
- 8 However, a snowmobile may be operated on the right-of-way of a
- 9 public highway against the flow of traffic if the right-of-way is a
- 10 snowmobile trail that is designated by the department in the plan
- 11 developed pursuant to section 82106(2) and that is approved by the
- 12 state transportation department. Snowmobiles operated on the right-
- 13 of-way of a public highway, as provided in this subdivision, shall
- 14 travel single file and shall not be operated abreast except when
- 15 overtaking and passing or being overtaken and passed by another
- 16 snowmobile. In the absence of a posted snowmobile speed limit, a
- 17 snowmobile operated on the right-of-way of a public highway, as
- 18 provided in this subdivision, shall not exceed the speed limit
- 19 posted on the public highway. A person who violates this
- 20 subdivision is responsible for a state civil infraction and may be
- 21 ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than \$150.00.
- (b) Subject to subsection (2), a snowmobile may be operated on
- 23 the right-of-way of a limited access public highway if it is
- 24 operated on a snowmobile trail that is designated by the department
- 25 in the plan developed pursuant to section 82106(2) and that is
- 26 approved by the state transportation department. A snowmobile shall
- 27 only be operated on that right-of-way in the manner provided in
- 28 that plan. In addition, a snowmobile operated on the right-of-way
- 29 of a public highway, as provided in this subdivision, shall travel

- 1 single file and shall not be operated abreast except when
- 2 overtaking and passing or being overtaken and passed by another
- 3 snowmobile. In the absence of a posted snowmobile speed limit, a
- 4 snowmobile operated on the right-of-way of a public highway, as
- 5 provided in this subdivision, shall not exceed the speed limit
- 6 posted on the public highway.
- 7 (c) A snowmobile may be operated on the roadway or shoulder
- 8 when necessary to cross a bridge or culvert if the snowmobile is
- 9 brought to a complete stop before entering onto the roadway or
- 10 shoulder and the driver yields the right-of-way to an approaching
- 11 vehicle on the highway.
- 12 (d) In a court action, in this state where if competent
- 13 evidence demonstrates that a vehicle that is permitted to be
- 14 operated on a highway pursuant to the Michigan vehicle code, 1949
- 15 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, collided with a snowmobile on a
- 16 roadway, the driver of the snowmobile involved in the collision
- 17 shall be considered prima facie negligent.
- 18 (e) A snowmobile may be operated across a public highway other
- 19 than a limited access highway, at a right angles—angle to the
- 20 highway, for the purpose of getting from 1 area to another when if
- 21 the operation can be done in safety and another vehicle is not
- 22 crossing the highway at the same time in the same general area. An
- 23 operator shall bring his or her snowmobile to a complete stop
- 24 before proceeding across the public highway and shall yield the
- 25 right-of-way to all oncoming traffic. A person who violates this
- 26 subdivision is responsible for a state civil infraction and may be
- 27 ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than \$150.00.
- (f) Snowmobiles may be operated on a highway in a county road
- 29 system that is not normally snowplowed for vehicular traffic and on

- 1 the plowed right-of-way or shoulder when no right-of-way exists on
- 2 a snowplowed highway in the county road system, outside the
- 3 corporate limits of a city or village, that is designated and
- 4 marked for snowmobile use by the county road commission having
- 5 jurisdiction. Upon the request of a county road commission that has
- 6 designated all county roads outside the corporate limits of a city
- 7 or village for snowmobile use, the state transportation department
- 8 shall erect at county road commission expense and shall maintain,
- 9 in accordance with the Michigan manual of uniform traffic control
- 10 devices—"Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices" standards, the
- 11 basic snowmobile sign unit together with a supplemental panel
- 12 stating "permitted on right-of-way or shoulder of all
- 13 (county name) roads MCL 324.82119" at the county line on all
- 14 state trunk line highways and county roads. A sign erected before
- 15 the effective date of the 2005 amendatory act that amended this
- 16 section December 27, 2005 may cite 1968 PA 74 instead of citing
- 17 this section.
- 18 (g) A law enforcement officer of a local unit of government or
- 19 the this state may authorize use of a snowmobile on a public
- 20 highway or street within his or her jurisdiction when during an
- 21 emergency occurs and when conventional motor vehicles cannot be
- 22 used for transportation due to because of snow or other extreme
- 23 highway conditions.
- 24 (h) A snowmobile may be operated on a highway or street for a
- 25 special event of limited duration conducted according to a
- 26 prearranged schedule only under permit from the governmental unit
- 27 having jurisdiction. The event may be conducted on the frozen
- 28 surface of public waters only under permit from the department.
- 29 (i) A city or village by ordinance may designate 1 or more

- 1 specific public highways or streets within its jurisdiction as
- 2 egress and ingress routes for the use of snowmobiles. A city or
- 3 village acting under the authority of this subdivision shall erect
- 4 and maintain, in accordance with the Michigan manual of uniform
- 5 traffic control devices "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices"
- 6 standards, a sign unit giving proper notice of the designation.
- 7 (2) The state transportation department and the department of
- 8 natural resources may permanently prohibit snowmobile use as
- 9 described in subsection (1)(a) or (b) in a highway right-of-way if,
- 10 within 10 years after the effective date of the amendatory act that
- 11 added this subsection, by December 27, 2015, all of the following
- 12 requirements are met:
- 13 (a) The right-of-way is designated in a closure plan developed
- 14 by the state transportation department and the department of
- 15 natural resources and approved by the state transportation
- 16 commission and the commission of natural resources commission.
- 17 (b) The state transportation department and the department of
- 18 natural resources have held a public hearing on the proposed
- 19 prohibition in the county where the prohibition is to apply. The
- 20 state transportation department and the department of natural
- 21 resources shall give notice of the hearing by publication in a
- 22 newspaper of general circulation in the county not more than 21 or
- 23 less than 7 days before the hearing.
- 24 (c) The state transportation department and the department
- 25 have consulted on the proposed prohibition with the snowmobile
- 26 advisory committee created under section 82102a.
- 27 (d) Snowmobile use in that right-of-way poses a particular and
- 28 demonstrable threat to public safety.
- (e) The department has designated and, if required under

- 1 subsection (1)(a) or (b), the state transportation department has
- 2 approved an alternative snowmobile trail that meets all of the
- 3 following requirements:
- 4 (i) Is open for use and functional during snowmobile season.
- $oldsymbol{5}$ (ii) Bypasses the highway right-of-way on which snowmobile use
- 6 is to be prohibited.
- 7 (iii) Provides access to any qualified business that, when the
- 8 alternative snowmobile trail is designated, is located along the
- 9 highway right-of-way on which snowmobile use is to be prohibited.
- 10 As used in this subparagraph, "qualified business" means a gas
- 11 station, restaurant, hotel, motel, convenience store, or grocery
- 12 store or any other business that relies on snowmobile-based
- 13 commerce.
- 14 (3) The state transportation department and the department of
- 15 natural resources may promulgate rules to implement subsections
- **16** (1) (b) and (2).
