## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4726**

April 28, 2021, Introduced by Rep. Meerman and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding section 18811a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 18811a. (1) During a qualified state of emergency or to
- 2 respond to a large-scale animal cruelty case, the board may grant a
- 3 license to engage in the practice of veterinary medicine or

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- 1 practice as a veterinary technician for up to 90 days to an
- 2 individual if all of the following requirements are met:
- 3 (a) The individual is authorized to engage in the practice of
- 4 veterinary medicine or practice as a veterinary technician in
- 5 another state that maintains licensing standards substantially
- 6 equivalent to those of this state.
- 7 (b) The applicant has established that disciplinary
- 8 proceedings before a similar licensure board of any other state are
- 9 not pending against the applicant.
- 10 (c) The applicant has established that if sanctions have been
- 11 imposed against the applicant by a similar licensure board of any
- 12 other state, the sanctions are not in force at the time of
- 13 application.
- 14 (d) The applicant agrees to not receive any direct or indirect
- 15 payment or compensation for any services performed under the
- 16 emergency license unless he or she is receiving the payment or
- 17 compensation from this state, the federal government, or a
- 18 nonprofit organization.
- 19 (2) The board shall grant a license within 48 to 72 hours of
- 20 receiving a completed application under this section and shall not
- 21 charge a fee for a license under this section.
- 22 (3) As used in this section, "qualified state of emergency"
- 23 means a state of disaster or state of emergency declared under the
- 24 emergency management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.401 to 30.421, or
- 25 1945 PA 302, MCL 10.31 to 10.33, that impacts animals.
