## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4839**

May 13, 2021, Introduced by Rep. Paquette and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 759 (MCL 168.759), as amended by 2020 PA 302.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 759. (1) Subject to section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before a primary or **a** special primary, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day of a primary or **a** special primary, an elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township or city

in which the elector is registered. The clerk of a city or township 1 shall not send by first-class mail an absent voter ballot to an 2 elector after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the election. 3 primary or special primary. Except as otherwise provided in section 4 761(2), the clerk of a city or township shall not issue an absent 5 6 voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 7 4 p.m. on the day before the election. primary or special primary. An application received before a primary or special primary may be 8 for either that primary or special primary only, or for that 9 10 primary or special primary and the election or special election 11 that immediately follows. In addition, the clerk of a city or township may provide an annual absent voter ballot application to 12 an elector that allows an elector to select any or all of the 13 14 elections to be held in the calendar year. If the secretary of 15 state provides an absent voter ballot application that contains 16 more election options than an absent voter ballot application 17 provided by a city or township, and the absent voter ballot 18 application otherwise complies with the requirements of this section, the clerk of the city or township shall honor the election 19 20 options requested by an elector who uses the absent voter ballot application provided by the secretary of state. An individual may 21 submit a voter registration application and an absent voter ballot 22 23 application at the same time if applying in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in which the individual 24 25 resides. Immediately after his or her voter registration application and absent voter ballot application are approved by the 26 27 clerk or deputy clerk, the individual may, subject to the identification requirement in section 761(6), complete an absent 28 29 voter ballot at the clerk's office.

- (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (1) and subject 1 to section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before an 2 election or special election, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day 3 of an election or special election, an elector may apply for an 5 absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail 6 with the clerk of the township - or city - or village in which the voter is registered. The clerk of a city or township shall not send 7 by first-class mail an absent voter ballot to an elector after 5 8 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the election or special 9 10 election. Except as otherwise provided in section 761(2), the clerk 11 of a city or township shall not issue an absent voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 4 p.m. on the day 12 before the election or special election. An individual may submit a 13 14 voter registration application and an absent voter ballot 15 application at the same time if applying in person with the clerk 16 or deputy clerk of the city or township in which the individual 17 resides. Immediately after his or her voter registration application and absent voter ballot application are approved by the 18 clerk, the individual may, subject to the identification 19 20 requirement in section 761(6), complete an absent voter ballot at 21 the clerk's office.
- 22 (3) An application for an absent voter ballot under this23 section may be made in any of the following ways:
  - (a) By a written request signed by the voter.
  - (b) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for that purpose by the clerk of the city or township.
  - (c) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for that purpose by the secretary of state.

It is a 3 violation of Michigan election law for a person an individual other 5 than those listed in the instructions to return, offer to return, 6 agree to return, or solicit to return your absent voter ballot 7 application to the clerk. An assistant authorized by the clerk who receives absent voter ballot applications at a location other than 8 the clerk's office must have credentials signed by the clerk. (6) The following instructions for an applicant for an absent voter ballot must be included with each application furnished an applicant:

28 29 1 INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS FOR ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS

Step 1. After completely filling out the application, sign and date the application in the place designated. Your signature must appear on the application or you may not receive an absent voter ballot.

Step 2. Deliver the application by 1 of the following methods:

- (a) Place the application in an envelope addressed to the appropriate clerk and place the necessary postage upon the return envelope and deposit it in the United States mail or with another public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service, or common carrier.
- 12 (b) Deliver the application personally to the clerk's office,13 to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk.
  - (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or grandchild or a person an individual residing in the voter's household may mail or deliver the application to the clerk for the applicant.
  - (d) If an applicant cannot return the application in any of the above methods, the applicant may select any registered elector to return the application. The person individual returning the application must sign and return the certificate at the bottom of the application.
  - (7) A person An individual who prints and distributes absent voter ballot applications shall print on the application the warning, certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent voter ballot application, and instructions required by this section.

- (8) A person An individual who makes a false statement in an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. A person An individual who forges a signature on an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a felony. A person An individual who is not authorized in this act and who both distributes absent voter ballot applications to absent voters and returns those absent voter ballot applications to a clerk or assistant of the clerk is guilty of a misdemeanor.
  - (9) The absent voter ballot application of an elector who is a program participant, as that term is defined in **section 3 of** the address confidentiality program act, **2020 PA 301, MCL 780.853**, is confidential and not subject to disclosure under the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
