## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4876**

May 18, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Alexander, Rendon, Meerman and Griffin and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 677 (MCL 168.677), as amended by 2018 PA 120.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 677. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4),
- 2 a precinct election inspector must be a qualified and registered
- 3 elector of this state, must have a good reputation, and must have
- 4 sufficient education and clerical ability to perform the duties of
- 5 the office. A person An individual must not be appointed to a board

- 1 of election inspectors unless the person individual has filed an
- 2 application both of the following with a city or township clerk in
- 3 that county where the individual wishes to serve as election
- 4 inspector:
- 5 (a) An application as described in subsection (2).
- 6 (b) A signed affidavit indicating his or her political party
  7 affiliation that must be from a political party recognized by the
  8 secretary of state.
- 9 (2) The application required under subsection (1) must be in
- 10 his or her own handwriting and must contain the applicant's name,
- 11 home address, ward and precinct registration if any, date of birth,
- 12 political party affiliation, education, employment, and other
- 13 experience qualifications. The application must provide a
- 14 certification that the applicant is not a member or a known active
- 15 advocate, as that term is defined in section 674, of a political
- 16 party other than the one political party entered on the
- 17 application. The form of the application under this section must be
- 18 approved by the state director of elections. The clerk shall
- 19 maintain a file of applications and affidavits filed under this
- 20 section and make the applications and affidavits available for
- 21 public inspection at the clerk's office during normal business
- 22 hours. In addition, the clerk shall make the affidavit for each
- 23 precinct election inspector appointed to a polling place or absent
- 24 voter counting board available for public inspection at that
- 25 polling place or absent voter counting board.
- 26 (3) A person An individual must not be knowingly appointed or
- 27 permitted to act as a precinct election inspector if the person
- 28 individual or any member of his or her immediate family is a
- 29 candidate for nomination or election to any office at the election

1 or who has been convicted of a felony or election crime. A person

- 2 An individual must not be permitted to act as an a precinct
- 3 election inspector if he or she has failed to attend a school of
- 4 instruction or failed to take an examination as provided in section
- 5 683. This section does not prohibit the candidate for or delegate
- 6 to a political party convention from acting as an a precinct
- 7 election inspector in a precinct other than the precinct in which
- 8 he or she resides. An election must not be invalidated merely
- 9 because of the violation of the provisions of this section.
- 10 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and
- 11 subject to subsection (5), a person an individual who is 16 or 17
- 12 years of age may be appointed to a board of election inspectors.
- 13 Before a person an individual may be appointed under this
- 14 subsection, the first 3 members of the board required to be
- 15 appointed under section 672 must meet the requirements of
- 16 subsections (1) to (3). A person An individual who is appointed
- 17 under this subsection must meet the requirements of subsections (1)
- 18 to (3) other than being a qualified and registered elector of this
- 19 state. A person An individual who is appointed under this
- 20 subsection is not eligible to be designated as chairperson of the
- 21 board under section 674.
- 22 (5) If a person an individual seeking appointment to a board
- 23 of election inspectors under subsection (4) is attending a K-12
- 24 school and if an election falls on a school day, the person shall
- 25 individual must provide to the clerk, along with the application
- 26 and affidavit filed under subsections (1) and (2), a written
- 27 document from his or her school specifically acknowledging that
- 28 person's individual's application for appointment to the board of
- 29 election inspectors and specifically excusing that person

- 1 individual from school on the date of service, if the appointment
- 2 is made.
