HOUSE BILL NO. 4913

May 25, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Beeler, Allor, Maddock, Fink, Paquette, Frederick, Outman, Griffin, Beson, Markkanen, Wozniak and LaFave and referred to the Committee on Military, Veterans and Homeland Security.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2018 PA 235.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1531. (1) Except as **otherwise** provided in this act, the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
- 3 requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
- 4 teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
- 5 an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an

- endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in anelementary grade in the public schools of the state.
- 3 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section or act, the
 4 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
 5 certificate to an individual who has passed appropriate
 6 examinations as follows:
- 7 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed the
 8 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
 9 area in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 10 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed,
 11 if it is available, the elementary certification examination, and
 12 has passed the appropriate available subject area examination for
 13 each subject area, if any, in which he or she applies to be
 14 certified.
- 15 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this **section or** act, the
 16 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a Michigan
 17 teaching certificate to an individual holding a certificate from
 18 another state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher
 19 preparation institution who applies for a Michigan teaching
 20 certificate only if the individual passes appropriate examinations
 21 as follows:
- 22 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass the
 23 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
 24 area in which he or she applies to be certified. The superintendent
 25 of public instruction may accept passage of an equivalent
 26 examination approved by the superintendent of public instruction to
 27 meet this requirement.
- (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass, if itis available, the elementary certification examination, and pass

- 1 the appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
- 2 area, if any, in which he or she applies to be certified. The
- 3 superintendent of public instruction may accept passage of an
- 4 equivalent examination approved by the superintendent of public
- 5 instruction to meet 1 or both of these requirements.
- 6 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this **section or** act, the
- 7 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
- 8 certificate to an individual who has met the elementary or
- 9 secondary, as applicable, reading credit requirements established
- 10 under superintendent of public instruction rule. If an individual
- 11 holds a teaching certificate, then beginning July 1, 2009,
- 12 notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of
- 13 public instruction shall not advance the individual's certification
- 14 to professional certification unless the individual has
- 15 successfully completed at least a 3-credit course of study with
- 16 appropriate field experiences in the diagnosis and remediation of
- 17 reading disabilities and differentiated instruction. To meet this
- 18 requirement, the course of study should include the following
- 19 elements, as determined by the department to be appropriate for the
- 20 individual's certification level and endorsements: interest
- 21 inventories, English language learning screening, visual and
- 22 auditory discrimination tools, language expression and processing
- 23 screening, phonemics, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, comprehension,
- 24 spelling and writing assessment tools, and instructional
- 25 strategies. An individual may complete the course of study either
- 26 as part of his or her teacher preparation program or during the
- 27 first 6 years of his or her employment in classroom teaching.
- 28 (5) Not later than January 11, 2002, the superintendent of
- 29 public instruction, in cooperation with appropriate curriculum

- 1 specialists and teacher educators, shall revise existing reading
- 2 standards to recognize reading disorders and to enable teachers to
- 3 make referrals for instruction and support for pupils with reading
- 4 disorders.
- 5 (6) Subject to subsection (8) and except as otherwise provided
- 6 in this section, if an individual holding a teaching certificate
- 7 from another state applies to the superintendent of public
- 8 instruction for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets the
- 9 requirements of this subsection, the superintendent of public
- 10 instruction shall issue to the individual a Michigan professional
- 11 education teaching certificate and applicable endorsements
- 12 comparable to those the individual holds in the other state,
- 13 without requiring the individual to pass the applicable subject
- 14 area examination otherwise required under subsection (2) or (3). To
- 15 Except as otherwise provided in this section, to be eligible to
- 16 receive a Michigan professional education teaching certificate
- 17 under this subsection, an individual shall provide evidence
- 18 satisfactory to the department that he or she meets all of the
- 19 following requirements:
- 20 (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a position
- 21 for which the individual's teaching certification from the other
- 22 state was valid.
- 23 (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in
- 24 another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned
- 25 course of study at an institution of higher education approved by
- 26 the superintendent of public instruction or has earned, at any
- 27 time, a master's or doctoral degree approved by the superintendent
- 28 of public instruction.
- (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,

- 1 reading credit requirement established under superintendent of
 2 public instruction rule.
- 3 (7) An individual who receives a teaching certificate and 4 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (6) is eligible to 5 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to 6 endorsements the individual holds in another state only if the 7 individual passes the appropriate subject area examinations 8 required under subsection (2) or (3).
- 9 (8) The superintendent of public instruction shall deny a
 10 Michigan teaching certificate to an individual described in
 11 subsection (6) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or
 12 concealment in the individual's application for a certificate or
 13 for a conviction for which an individual's teaching certificate may
 14 be revoked under section 1535a.
- (9) The department, based upon criteria recommended under subsection (11), shall provide to approved teacher education institutions approved guidelines and criteria for use in the development or selection of subject area examinations.
- 19 (10) For the purposes of this section, the superintendent of 20 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under 21 subsection (11), shall develop, select, or develop and select 1 or 22 more subject area examinations. In addition, the superintendent of 23 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under 24 subsection (11), shall approve an elementary certification 25 examination and a reading subject area examination. If the department develops for use under this subsection an examination 26 27 that had previously been contracted for using a competitive bid process, then the department shall not expend on the development of 28 29 that examination an amount that exceeds the amount that the

- 1 department expended on procurement of the most recent
- 2 competitively-bid version of that examination.
- 3 (11) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint an
- 4 11-member teacher examination advisory committee composed of
- 5 representatives of approved teacher education institutions and
- 6 Michigan education organizations and associations. Not more than
- 7 1/2 of the members comprising this committee shall must be
- 8 certified teachers. This committee shall recommend criteria to be
- 9 used by the superintendent of public instruction in the
- 10 development, selection, or development and selection of subject
- 11 area examinations. In addition, the committee shall recommend
- 12 guidelines for the use and administration of those examinations.
- 13 (12) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a
- 14 7-member standing technical advisory council composed of
- 15 individuals who are experts in measurement and assessment. This
- 16 council shall advise the superintendent of public instruction and
- 17 the teacher examination committee on the validity, reliability, and
- 18 other technical standards of the examinations that will be used or
- 19 are being used and of the administration and use of those
- 20 examinations.
- 21 (13) Not later than November 30 of each year, the
- 22 superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a
- 23 report on the development or selection and use of the elementary
- 24 certification examination and the subject area examinations to the
- 25 house and senate education committees. The report shall must also
- 26 contain a financial statement regarding revenue received from the
- 27 assessment of fees levied under subsection (15) and the amount of
- 28 and any purposes for which that revenue was expended.
- 29 (14) The Except as otherwise provided in this section, the

- 1 elementary certification examination and the subject area
- 2 examinations required by this section may be taken at different
- 3 times during an approved teacher preparation program, but the
- 4 elementary certification examination and the subject area
- 5 examinations, as applicable, must be passed before an individual is
- 6 recommended for certification.
- 7 (15) The department, or if approved by the superintendent of
- 8 public instruction, a private testing service, may assess fees for
- 9 taking the elementary certification examination and the subject
- 10 area examinations. The fees, which shall must be set by the
- 11 superintendent of public instruction, shall must not exceed the
- 12 actual cost of the examination and of administering the
- 13 examination. Fees received by the department shall must be expended
- 14 solely for administrative expenses that it incurs in implementing
- 15 this section. If the superintendent of public instruction increases
- 16 a fee charged for an examination under this subsection, at least 1
- 17 year before implementing the fee increase, the department shall
- 18 notify each approved teacher education institution of the amount of
- 19 the fee increase. An approved teacher education institution shall
- 20 notify each of its affected students of the timing and amount of
- 21 such a fee increase.
- 22 (16) #f-Except as otherwise provided in this section, if an
- 23 individual holding a teaching certificate from another state
- 24 applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets all
- 25 requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except passage
- 26 of the appropriate examinations under subsection (3), the
- 27 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable
- 28 temporary teaching certificate, good for 1 year, to the individual.
- 29 The Except as otherwise provided in this section, the

superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a Michigan
teaching certificate to the individual after expiration of the
temporary teaching certificate unless the individual passes
appropriate examinations as described in subsection (3).

(17) As used in this section:

- (a) "Elementary certification examination" means a comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has been developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.
- (b) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to a specific area of certification, which examination has been developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
- (17) (18) The superintendent of public instruction shall promulgate rules for the implementation of this section.
 - (18) (19) Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of public instruction shall continue to issue state elementary or secondary continuing education certificates under R 390.1132(1) of the Michigan Administrative Code to individuals who completed the requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and who apply for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994. If the superintendent of public instruction has issued a state elementary or secondary professional education certificate to an individual described in this section, the superintendent of public

- 1 instruction shall consider the individual to have a state
- 2 elementary or secondary, as applicable, continuing education
- 3 certificate.
- 4 (19) (20) Not later than January 1, 2019, the superintendent
- 5 of public instruction, in consultation with the department of
- 6 talent and economic development labor and economic opportunity and
- 7 groups or individuals representing employers, economic development
- 8 agencies, trade unions, secondary school principals, middle and
- 9 elementary school principals, teachers, school district and
- 10 intermediate school district superintendents, and others as
- 11 determined appropriate by the department, shall promulgate rules to
- 12 allow an individual to use time spent engaging with local employers
- 13 or technical centers toward the renewal of a teaching certificate
- 14 in the same manner as state continuing education or professional
- 15 development.
- 16 (20) The superintendent of public instruction shall issue a
- 17 teaching certificate to an individual who is a qualified military
- 18 veteran, who meets the requirements under section 1531d, as
- 19 applicable, and who meets both of the following requirements:
- 20 (a) Has earned a bachelor's degree from a degree- or
- 21 certificate-granting public or private college or university,
- 22 junior college, or community college located within the United
- 23 States.
- 24 (b) Provides documentation to the department, in a form and
- 25 manner prescribed by the department, showing that he or she has
- 26 obtained certification issued by any branch of the Armed Forces of
- 27 the United States, any reserve branch of the Armed Forces of the
- 28 United States, the Michigan National Guard, or the United States
- 29 Department of Defense permitting him or her to train service

- 1 members.
- 2 (21) The superintendent of public instruction shall not, as a
- 3 condition for the issuance of a teaching certificate to a qualified
- 4 military veteran who meets the requirements under section 1531d, as
- 5 applicable, and subsection (20), require that the qualified
- 6 military veteran meet requirements in addition to the requirements
- 7 under section 1531d and subsection (20).
- 8 (22) As used in this section:
- 9 (a) "Elementary certification examination" means a
- 10 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has
- 11 been developed or selected by the superintendent of public
- 12 instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 13 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary
- 14 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is
- 15 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.
- 16 (b) "Michigan National Guard" means that term as defined in
- 17 section 105 of the Michigan military act, 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.505.
- 18 (c) "Qualified military veteran" means an individual to whom
- 19 both of the following apply:
- 20 (i) The individual is a veteran as that term is defined in
- 21 section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61.
- 22 (ii) The individual was honorably discharged.
- 23 (d) "Service member" means a member of the Armed Forces of the
- 24 United States, a reserve branch of the Armed Forces of the United
- 25 States, or the Michigan National Guard.
- 26 (e) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to
- 27 a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 28 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 29 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and

- 1 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not
- 2 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
