A bill to establish a local teacher supply reimbursement program; to create the local teacher supply reimbursement fund in the state treasury; to provide for the distribution of the money from the fund; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain agencies and officials; and to provide for appropriations.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "local
- 2 teacher supply reimbursement program act".
- 3 Sec. 3. As used in this act:

- 1 (a) "Department" means the department of treasury.
- 2 (b) "Fund" means the local teacher supply reimbursement fund3 created in section 7.
- 4 (c) "Intermediate school district" means that term as defined 5 in section 4 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.4.
- 6 (d) "Local teacher supply reimbursement program" or "program"7 means the program created in section 5.
- 8 (e) "Michigan school district" means a school district, an9 intermediate school district, or a public school academy.
- 10 (f) "Public school academy" means that term as defined in 11 section 5 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.5.
- 12 (g) "School district" means that term as defined in section 6 13 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.6.
- Sec. 5. (1) The department shall establish and administer a local teacher supply reimbursement program to provide grants to Michigan school districts to reimburse state-certified teachers within its district for out-of-pocket classroom and school supply expenses that they have incurred as state-certified teachers. The department shall issue grants to Michigan school districts under this act from the local teacher supply reimbursement fund.
- 25 (2) By July 1 of each year, the department shall issue a grant 26 to each Michigan school district in an amount equal to the 27 contribution designations made and specifically designated to that 28 district on a tax return filed under the income tax act of 1967, 29 1967 PA 281, MCL 206.1 to 206.713.

- 1 (3) The department may promulgate rules in accordance with the 2 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- 3 24.328, to implement and administer this program.
- 4 Sec. 7. (1) The local teacher supply reimbursement fund is
- 5 created as a separate fund in the department to provide grants to
- 6 Michigan school districts through the local teacher supply
- 7 reimbursement program. The department shall be the administrator of
- 8 the fund for auditing purposes.
- 9 (2) The state treasurer shall credit to the fund all amounts
- 10 appropriated for this purpose under sections 435 and 695 of the
- 11 income tax act of 1967, 1967 PA 281, MCL 206.435 and 206.695, and
- 12 money from any other source for deposit into the fund.
- 13 (3) Contributions to the local teacher supply reimbursement
- 14 fund are exempt from taxation as provided in sections 30 and 623 of
- 15 the income tax act of 1967, 1967 PA 281, MCL 206.30 and 206.623.
- 16 (4) The state treasurer shall direct the investment of the
- 17 fund. The fund shall consist of the money credited to the fund
- 18 pursuant to sections 435 and 695 of the income tax act of 1967,
- 19 1967 PA 281, MCL 206.435 and 206.695, any interest and earnings
- 20 accruing from the saving and investment of that money, and money
- 21 from any other source.
- 22 (5) Money in the fund at the close of the year shall remain in
- 23 the fund and shall not lapse to the general fund.
- 24 Sec. 9. The money, interest, and earnings of the fund shall
- 25 only be expended to provide grants to Michigan school districts
- 26 under the local teacher supply reimbursement program.
- Sec. 11. The money in the fund that is available for
- 28 distribution shall be appropriated each year. Money granted or
- 29 received as a gift or donation to the fund is available for

- 1 distribution upon appropriation.
- 2 Enacting section 1. This act does not take effect unless
- 3 Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 5103 (request no. 02896'21)
- 4 of the 101st Legislature is enacted into law.
