A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 931 (MCL 168.931), as amended by 1996 PA 583.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 931. (1) A person who violates 1 or more of the following 2 subdivisions is quilty of a misdemeanor:
- 3 (a) A person shall not, either directly or indirectly, give,
- 4 lend, or promise valuable consideration —to or for any person —as
- 5 an inducement to influence the manner of voting by a person

- 1 relative to a candidate or ballot question or as a reward for
 2 refraining from voting.
- 3 (b) A person shall not, either before, on, or after an
 4 election, for the person's own benefit or on behalf of any other
 5 person, receive, agree, or contract for valuable consideration for
 6 1 or more of the following:
- 7 (i) Voting or agreeing to vote, or inducing or attempting to8 induce another to vote, at an election.
- 9 (ii) Refraining or agreeing to refrain, or inducing or 10 attempting to induce another to refrain, from voting at an election.
- 12 (iii) Doing anything prohibited by this act.
- (iv) Both distributing absent voter ballot applications to
 voters and receiving signed applications from voters for delivery
 to the appropriate clerk or assistant of the clerk. This
 subparagraph does not apply to an authorized election official.
- 17 (c) A person shall not solicit any valuable consideration from a candidate for nomination for, or election to, an office described 18 in this act. This subdivision does not apply to requests for 19 20 contributions of money by or to an authorized representative of the 21 political party committee of the organization to which the 22 candidate belongs. This subdivision does not apply to a regular 23 business transaction between a candidate and any other person that 24 is not intended for, or connected with, the securing of votes or 25 the influencing of voters in connection with the nomination or 26 election.
- (d) A person shall not, either directly or indirectly,discharge or threaten to discharge an employee of the person forthe purpose of influencing the employee's vote at an election.

- 1 (e) A priest, pastor, curate, or other officer of a religious
 2 society shall not for the purpose of influencing a voter at an
 3 election, impose or threaten to impose upon the voter a penalty of
 4 excommunication, dismissal, or expulsion —or command or advise the
 5 voter —under pain of religious disapproval.
 - (f) A person shall not hire a motor vehicle or other conveyance or cause the same to be done, for conveying voters, other than voters physically unable to walk, to an election.

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- 9 (f) (g)—In a city, township, village, or school district that 10 has a board of election commissioners authorized to appoint 11 inspectors of election, an inspector of election, a clerk, or other election official who accepts an appointment as an inspector of 12 election shall not fail to report at the polling place designated 13 14 on election morning at the time specified by the board of election 15 commissioners, unless excused as provided in this subdivision. A 16 person who violates this subdivision is quilty of a misdemeanor aupunishable by a fine of not more than \$10.00 or imprisonment for 17 18 not more than 10 days, or both. An inspector of election, clerk, or 19 other election official who accepts an appointment as an inspector 20 of election is excused for failing to report at the polling place on election day and is not subject to a fine or imprisonment under 21 this subdivision if 1 or more of the following requirements are 22 23 met:
 - (i) The inspector of election, clerk, or other election official notifies the board of election commissioners or other officers in charge of elections of his or her inability to serve at the time and place specified, 3 days or more before the election.
 - (ii) The inspector of election, clerk, or other election official is excused from duty by the board of election

- 1 commissioners or other officers in charge of elections for cause
 2 shown.
- (g) (h)—A person shall not willfully fail to perform a duty imposed upon that person by this act —or disobey a lawful instruction or order of the secretary of state as chief state election officer or of a board of county election commissioners, board of city election commissioners, or board of inspectors of election.
- 9 (h) (i) A delegate or member of a convention shall not solicit 10 a candidate for nomination before the convention for money, reward, 11 position, place, preferment, or other valuable consideration in return for support by the delegate or member in the convention. A 12 candidate or other person shall not promise or give to a delegate 13 14 money, reward, position, place, preferment, or other valuable 15 consideration in return for support by or vote of the delegate in 16 the convention.
- 17 (i) (j) A person elected to the office of delegate to a
 18 convention shall not accept or receive any money or other valuable
 19 consideration for his or her vote as a delegate.
- 20 (j) (k) A person shall not, while the polls are open on an
 21 election day, solicit votes in a polling place or within 100 feet
 22 from an entrance to the building in which a polling place is
 23 located.

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(k) (1)—A person shall not keep a room or building for the purpose, in whole or in part, of recording or registering bets or wagers, or of selling pools upon the result of a political nomination, appointment, or election. A person shall not wager property, money, or thing of value, or be the custodian of money, property, or thing of value —staked, wagered, or pledged upon the

- 1 result of a political nomination, appointment, or election.
- 2 (l) (m)—A person shall not participate in a meeting or a
- 3 portion of a meeting of more than 2 persons, other than the
- 4 person's immediate family, at which an absent voter ballot is
- 5 voted.
- 6 (m) (n)—A person, other than an authorized election official,
- 7 shall not, either directly or indirectly, give, lend, or promise
- 8 any valuable consideration to or for a person to induce that person
- 9 to both distribute absent voter ballot applications to voters and
- 10 receive signed absent voter ballot applications from voters for
- 11 delivery to the appropriate clerk.
- 12 (2) A person who violates a provision of this act for which a
- 13 penalty is not otherwise specifically provided in this act —is
- 14 quilty of a misdemeanor.
- 15 (3) A person or a person's agent who knowingly makes,
- 16 publishes, disseminates, circulates, or places before the public,
- 17 or knowingly causes directly or indirectly to be made, published,
- 18 disseminated, circulated, or placed before the public, in this
- 19 state, either orally or in writing, an assertion, representation,
- 20 or statement of fact concerning a candidate for public office at an
- 21 election in this state, that is false, deceptive, scurrilous, or
- 22 malicious, without the true name of the author being subscribed to
- 23 the assertion, representation, or statement if written, or
- 24 announced if unwritten, is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 25 (4) As used in this section, "valuable consideration"
- 26 includes, but is not limited to, money, property, a gift, a prize
- 27 or chance for a prize, a fee, a loan, an office, a position, an
- 28 appointment, or employment.
