## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5518**

November 03, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Koleszar, Breen, Puri, Kuppa, Morse, Lasinski, Hope, Stone, Cynthia Johnson, Sabo, Steckloff, Haadsma, Scott, Cavanagh, Sowerby, Hood, Rabhi, Tate, Young, Yancey and Anthony and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 765, 765a, and 765b (MCL 168.765, 168.765a, and 168.765b), as amended by 2020 PA 177.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 765. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (6),
- 2 a clerk who receives an absent voter ballot return envelope
- 3 containing the marked ballots of an absent voter shall not open
- 4 that envelope before delivering the envelope to the board of

- 1 election inspectors as provided in this section. Except as
- 2 otherwise provided in subsection (6), the city or township clerk
- 3 shall safely keep in his or her office until election day, or until
- 4 an earlier day as provided in subsection (2), any absent voter
- 5 ballot return envelopes received by the clerk before election day
- 6 containing the marked ballots of an absent voter.
- 7 (2) If a city or township establishes absent voter counting
- 8 boards under section 765a that meet to open, process, and tabulate
- 9 absent voter ballots before election day, the clerk of that city or
- 10 township shall deliver the absent voter ballot return envelopes to
- 11 the chairperson or other member of the board of election inspectors
- 12 in that absent voter's absent voter counting board precinct each
- 13 day that the absent voter counting board meets before election day.
- 14 Before the opening of the polls on election day or as soon after
- 15 the opening of the polls as possible, the clerk shall deliver the
- 16 absent voter ballot return envelopes to the chairperson or other
- 17 member of the board of election inspectors in the absent voter's
- 18 precinct, together with the signed absent voter ballot applications
- 19 received by the clerk from any voters of that precinct and the
- 20 clerk's list or record kept relative to those absent voters.
- 21 However, if higher numbered ballots are used under section 717, the
- 22 clerk shall retain the applications and lists in his or her office
- 23 and shall keep the applications and lists open to public inspection
- 24 at all reasonable hours. Absent Except as otherwise provided in
- 25 section 765a, absent voter ballots must not be tabulated before the
- 26 opening of the polls on election day.
- 27 (3) The city or township clerk, or authorized designee of the
- 28 clerk, shall call for and receive absent voter ballots from the
- 29 post office at which the city or township clerk regularly receives

- 1 mail addressed to the city or township clerk on election day. Any
- 2 envelopes containing absent voter ballots that are received from
- 3 the post office or from voters who voted by absentee ballot in
- 4 person in the clerk's office on election day must be delivered to
- 5 the board of election inspectors or, except as otherwise provided
- 6 in section 764d, the absent voter counting boards to be tabulated.
- 7 (4) If a marked absent voter ballot is received by the clerk
- 8 after the close of the polls, the clerk shall plainly mark the
- 9 envelope with the time and date of receipt and shall file the
- 10 envelope in his or her office.
- 11 (5) On or before 8 a.m. on election day, the clerk shall post
- 12 in the clerk's office or otherwise make public the number of absent
- 13 voter ballots the clerk distributed to absent voters and the number
- 14 of absent voter ballot return envelopes containing the marked
- 15 ballots of absent voters received by the clerk before election day
- 16 and to be delivered to the board of election inspectors or the
- 17 absent voter counting boards under this act. On or before 9 p.m. on
- 18 election day, the clerk shall post in the clerk's office or
- 19 otherwise make public the number of absent voter ballot return
- 20 envelopes containing the marked ballots of absent voters received
- 21 by the clerk on election day and delivered to the board of election
- 22 inspectors, under subsection (3), along with the total number of
- 23 absent voter ballot return envelopes containing the marked ballots
- 24 of absent voters received by the clerk both before and on election
- 25 day and delivered to the board of election inspectors or the absent
- 26 voter counting boards under this act. As soon as possible after all
- 27 precincts in the city or township are processed, the clerk shall
- 28 post in the clerk's office or otherwise make public the number of
- 29 absent voter ballot return envelopes containing the marked ballots

- 1 of absent voters received by the election inspectors at the
- 2 precincts on election day, along with the total number of absent
- 3 voter ballot return envelopes containing the marked ballots of
- 4 absent voters received in the city or township for that election.
- 5 This subsection applies only to elections in which a federal or
- 6 state office appears on the ballot.
- 7 (6) For the November 3, 2020 general election only, if the
- 8 clerk of a city or township with a population of at least 25,000
- 9 provides written notice in compliance with this subsection to the
- 10 secretary of state 20 days or more before election day, that city
- 11 or township clerk, or his or her authorized designee, may between
- 12 the hours of 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. on the day before election day
- 13 perform certain absent voter ballot pre-processing activities as
- 14 described in this subsection. The written notice provided to the
- 15 secretary of state must include the location and hours that the
- 16 absent voter ballot return envelopes will be opened in that city or
- 17 township. The secretary of state shall post any written notice
- 18 received from the clerk of a city or township under this subsection
- 19 on the department of state website. In addition, the clerk of the
- 20 city or township shall post the written notice provided to the
- 21 secretary of state on the city or township website. The board of
- 22 election commissioners shall appoint election inspectors to the
- 23 location where absent voter ballot return envelopes will be opened
- 24 in that city or township not less than 21 days or more than 40 days
- 25 before the day at which they are to be used. Election inspectors
- 26 may be appointed by the board of election commissioners under this
- 27 subsection before written notice is provided to the secretary of
- 28 state under this subsection. Sections 673a and 674 apply to the
- 29 appointment of election inspectors under this subsection. All

- 1 requirements for election inspectors appointed to an absent voter
- 2 counting board under section 765a apply to election inspectors
- 3 appointed under this subsection. At all times, at least 1 election
- 4 inspector from each major political party must be present at the
- 5 location and the policies and procedures adopted by the secretary
- 6 of state regarding the handling of absent voter ballot return
- 7 envelopes and absent voter ballot secrecy envelopes must be
- 8 followed. After providing written notice to the secretary of state
- 9 in compliance with this subsection, a city or township clerk, or
- 10 his or her authorized designee, on the day before election day is
- 11 only authorized to perform standard processing activities up to and
- 12 including the opening of absent voter ballot return envelopes and
- 13 the removal of absent voter ballot secrecy envelopes containing
- 14 absent voter ballots and to verify that the ballot number on the
- 15 ballot stub agrees with the ballot number on the absent voter
- 16 ballot return envelope label. The city or township clerk, or his or
- 17 her authorized designee, is not authorized to remove absent voter
- 18 ballots from the absent voter ballot secrecy envelopes. If an
- 19 opened absent voter ballot return envelope contains an absent voter
- 20 ballot that is not contained in an absent voter ballot secrecy
- 21 envelope, the city or township clerk, or his or her designee, shall
- 22 immediately insert that absent voter ballot into an absent voter
- 23 ballot secrecy envelope. The opening of absent voter ballot return
- 24 envelopes must be done at a location designated by the city or
- 25 township clerk, and the location and opening of absent voter ballot
- 26 return envelopes must be accessible to challengers as described in
- 27 section 730. The election inspectors appointed to the location
- 28 where absent voter ballot return envelopes will be opened in that
- 29 city or township must never leave the absent voter ballot secrecy

- 1 envelopes unattended. Once the absent voter ballot return envelopes
- 2 have been opened as provided in this subsection, the absent voter
- 3 ballot secrecy envelopes containing the absent voter ballots to be
- 4 counted must be stored, secured, and sealed in an absent voter
- 5 ballot secrecy envelope container, as described in section 24k, or
- 6 stored, secured, and sealed in a ballot container approved under
- 7 section 24j. The city or township clerk shall record the seal
- 8 number in the poll book, or an addendum to the poll book, and
- 9 follow all other policies and procedures adopted by the secretary
- 10 of state regarding absent voter ballots. The poll book, or an
- 11 addendum to the poll book, must be signed and dated by 1 election
- 12 inspector from each major political party who is present at the
- 13 location on the day before election day. The city or township clerk
- 14 shall store the absent voter ballot secrecy envelope container
- 15 containing the absent voter ballot secrecy envelopes in a secure
- 16 location until election day.
- 17 (7) The election inspectors who are appointed under subsection
- 18 (6) shall record in the poll book, or an addendum to the poll book,
- 19 all of the following:
- 20 (a) The number of absent voter ballot return envelopes that
- 21 were opened on the day before election day.
- (b) The number of absent voter ballot return envelopes
- 23 delivered to the election inspectors that did not contain an
- 24 elector's signature and that were returned to the city or township
- 25 clerk.
- (c) The number of absent voter ballot return envelopes that
- 27 were challenged, not opened by the election inspectors, and set
- 28 aside to be processed by the election inspectors on election day.
- 29 (8) The election inspectors who are appointed to an absent

- voter counting board on election day as provided in section 765a
  shall do all of the following:
- 3 (a) Verify the seal number recorded in the poll book, or an
  4 addendum to the poll book, for any absent voter ballot secrecy
  5 envelope container delivered to the absent voter counting board.
- 6 (b) Count and record in the poll book, or an addendum to the7 poll book, both of the following:
- 8 (i) The number of absent voter ballot return envelopes opened
  9 by the election inspectors on the day before election day as
  10 provided under subsection (6) and the number of absent voter ballot
  11 secrecy envelopes delivered to the absent voter counting board on
  12 election day.

- (ii) The number of absent voter ballot return envelopes that were challenged, not opened by the election inspectors on the day before election day, and set aside to be processed by the election inspectors on election day.
- 17 (9) Not later than March 1, 2021, the secretary of state shall 18 provide a written report to the house and senate committees dealing 19 with elections that contains all of the following information:
- (a) The number of cities and townships that performed absent
  voter ballot pre-processing activities as described in subsection
  (6).
- (b) The names of the cities and townships that performed absent voter ballot pre-processing activities as described in subsection (6), and all of the following information for each of those cities and townships:
- 27 (i) The number of registered electors in each city or township.
- 28 (ii) The number of active registered electors in each city or township.

- ${f 1}$  (iii) The number of electors who voted by absent voter ballot in each city or township.
- (iv) The number of electors who voted in person on election day in each city or township.
- 5 ( $\nu$ ) The number of absent voter ballots that were not returned 6 in each city or township.
- 7 (vi) The number of electors on a permanent absent voter list in 8 each city or township, if applicable.
- $\mathbf{9}$  (vii) The number of ballots that had to be duplicated in each city or township.
- (c) The total number of absent voter ballot return envelopesthat were opened on the day before election day.
- (d) The total number of absent voter ballot return envelopes delivered to the election inspectors that did not contain an elector's signature and that were returned to the city or township clerk.
- (e) The total number of absent voter ballot return envelopes that were challenged, not opened by the election inspectors, and set aside to be processed by the election inspectors on election day.
- (f) The total number of absent voter ballot secrecy envelopesthat were stored in an absent voter ballot secrecy envelopecontainer.
- (g) For each city or township that performed absent voter
  ballot pre-processing activities as described in subsection (6),
  whether the number of absent voter ballot return envelopes opened
  on the day before election day matched the number of absent voter
  ballot secrecy envelopes delivered to the absent voter counting
  board on election day.

Sec. 765a. (1) Subject to section 764d, if a city or township 1 decides to use absent voter counting boards, the board of election 2 commissioners of that city or township shall establish an absent 3 voter counting board for each election day precinct in that city or 4 5 township. A city or township may authorize absent voter counting 6 boards to be established to meet not only on election day, but also 7 for up to 7 days before election day. The city or township shall 8 provide notice of those absent voter counting boards authorized to 9 meet on days before election day as provided in subsection (14). 10 Absent voter counting boards established and authorized to meet on 11 days before election day must comply with the requirements in 12 subsection (15). The ballot form of an absent voter counting board must correspond to the ballot form of the election day precinct for 13 14 which it is established. After the polls close on election day, the 15 county, city, or township clerk responsible for producing the 16 accumulation report of the election results submitted by the boards 17 of precinct election inspectors shall format the accumulation 18 report to clearly indicate all of the following:

(a) The election day precinct returns.

- (b) The corresponding absent voter counting board returns.
- (c) A total of each election day precinct return and each corresponding absent voter counting board return.
- (2) Subject to section 764d, the board of election
  commissioners shall establish the absent voter counting boards.
  Subject to section 764d, the board of election commissioners shall
  appoint the election inspectors to those absent voter counting
  boards not less than 21 days or more than 40 days before the
  election at which they are to be used. Sections 673a and 674 apply
  to the appointment of election inspectors to absent voter counting

- 1 boards under this section. The board of election commissioners
- 2 shall determine the number of ballots that may be expeditiously
- 3 counted by an absent voter counting board in a reasonable period of
- 4 time, taking into consideration the size and complexity of the
- 5 ballot to be counted pursuant to the guidelines of the secretary of
- 6 state. Combined ballots must be regarded as the number of ballots
- 7 as there are sections to the ballot.
- 8 (3) If more than 1 absent voter counting board is to be used,
- 9 the city or township clerk shall determine the number of electronic
- 10 voting systems or the number of ballot boxes and the number of
- 11 election inspectors to be used in each of the absent voter counting
- 12 boards and to which absent voter counting board the absent voter
- 13 ballots for each precinct are assigned for counting.
- 14 (4) In a city or township that uses absent voter counting
- 15 boards under this section, absent voter ballots must be counted in
- 16 the manner provided in this section and, except as otherwise
- 17 provided in section 764d, absent voter ballots must not be
- 18 delivered to the polling places. Subject to section 764d, the board
- 19 of election commissioners shall provide a place for each absent
- 20 voter counting board to count the absent voter ballots. Section 662
- 21 applies to the designation and prescribing of the absent voter
- 22 counting place or places in which the absent voter counting board
- 23 performs its duties under this section, except the location may be
- 24 in a different jurisdiction if the county provides a tabulator for
- 25 use at a central absent voter counting board location in that
- 26 county. The places must be designated as absent voter counting
- 27 places. Except as otherwise provided in this section, laws relating
- 28 to paper ballot precincts, including laws relating to the
- 29 appointment of election inspectors, apply to absent voter counting

- places. The provisions of this section relating to placing of
  absent voter ballots on electronic voting systems apply. More than
  1 absent voter counting board may be located in 1 building.
- 4 (5) The clerk of a city or township that uses absent voter
  5 counting boards shall supply each absent voter counting board with
  6 supplies necessary to carry out its duties under this act. The
  7 supplies must be furnished to the city or township clerk in the
  8 same manner and by the same persons or agencies as for other
  9 precincts.
- 10 (6) Subject to section 764d, absent voter ballots received by 11 the clerk before election day must be delivered to the absent voter counting board by the clerk or the clerk's authorized assistant at 12 the time the election inspectors of the absent voter counting 13 14 boards report for duty, which time must be established by the board 15 of election commissioners or, if absent voter counting boards are 16 authorized to be established before election day, by the city or 17 township. Except as otherwise provided in section 764d, absent 18 voter ballots received by the clerk before the time set for the 19 closing of the polls on election day must be delivered to the 20 absent voter counting boards. Except as otherwise provided in section 765(6), absent voter ballots must be delivered to the 21 absent voter counting boards or combined absent voter counting 22 23 boards in the sealed absent voter ballot return envelopes in which 24 they were returned to the clerk. Written or stamped on each of the 25 return envelopes must be the time and the date that the envelope 26 was received by the clerk and a statement by the clerk that the 27 signatures of the absent voters on the envelopes have been checked 28 and found to agree with the signatures of the voters on the 29 registration cards or the digitized signatures of voters contained

- 1 in the qualified voter file as provided under section 766. If it is
- 2 determined after 8 p.m. on the day before election day that a
- 3 signature on the registration card or a digitized signature
- 4 contained in the qualified voter file and on the absent voter
- 5 ballot return envelope does not agree as provided under section
- 6 766, if it is determined after 8 p.m. on the day before election
- 7 day that the absent voter failed to sign the envelope, or if the
- 8 statement of the absent voter is not properly executed, the clerk
- 9 shall mark the envelope "rejected" and the reason for the rejection
- 10 and shall place his or her name under the notation. An envelope
- 11 marked "rejected" must not be delivered to the absent voter
- 12 counting board or combined absent voter counting board but must be
- 13 preserved by the clerk until other ballots are destroyed in the
- 14 manner provided in this act. If before 8 p.m. on the day before
- 15 election day the clerk of a city or township rejects an absent
- 16 voter ballot return envelope because the signature on the absent
- 17 voter ballot return envelope does not agree sufficiently with the
- 18 signature on the master card or the digitized signature contained
- 19 in the qualified voter file so as to identify the elector or
- 20 because the elector failed to sign the absent voter ballot return
- 21 envelope, the city or township clerk shall as soon as practicable,
- 22 but in no event later than 48 hours after determining the
- 23 signatures do not agree sufficiently or that the signature is
- 24 missing, or by 8 p.m. on the day before election day, whichever
- 25 occurs first, notify the elector of the rejection by mail,
- 26 telephone, or electronic mail. email. The clerk shall also comply
- 27 with section 765(5).
- 28 (7) This chapter does not prohibit an absent voter from voting
- 29 in person within the voter's precinct at an election,

1 notwithstanding that the voter may have applied for an absent voter

- 2 ballot and the ballot may have been mailed or otherwise delivered
- 3 to the voter. The voter, the election inspectors, and other
- 4 election officials shall proceed in the manner prescribed in
- 5 section 769. The clerk shall preserve the canceled ballots for 2
- 6 years.
- 7 (8) The absent voter counting boards and combined absent voter
- 8 counting boards shall process the ballots and returns in as nearly
- 9 as possible the same manner as ballots are processed in paper
- 10 ballot precincts. The poll book may be combined with the absent
- 11 voter list or record required by section 760, and the applications
- 12 for absent voter ballots may be used as the poll list. The Except
- 13 as otherwise provided in this section, the processing and tallying
- 14 of absent voter ballots may commence at 7 a.m. on the election day.
- 15 of the election.
- 16 (9) An election inspector, challenger, or any other person
- 17 individual in attendance at an absent voter counting place or
- 18 combined absent voter counting place at any time after the
- 19 processing of ballots has begun shall take and sign the following
- 20 oath that may be administered by the chairperson or a member of the
- 21 absent voter counting board or combined absent voter counting
- 22 board:
- "I (name of person\_individual taking oath) do solemnly swear
- 24 (or affirm) that I shall not communicate in any way any information
- 25 relative to the processing or tallying of votes that may come to me
- 26 while in this counting place until after the polls are closed.".
- 27 (10) The oaths administered under subsection (9) must be
- 28 placed in an envelope provided for the purpose and sealed with the
- 29 red state seal. Following the election, the oaths must be delivered

to the city or township clerk. Except as otherwise provided in 1 subsection (12), a person an individual in attendance at the absent 2 voter counting place or combined absent voter counting place shall 3 not leave the counting place after the tallying has begun until the 4 5 polls close. Subject to this subsection, the clerk of a city or 6 township may allow the election inspectors appointed to an absent 7 voter counting board in that city or township to work in shifts on election day. A second or subsequent shift of election inspectors 8 9 appointed for an absent voter counting board may begin that shift 10 at any time on election day as provided by the city or township 11 clerk. However, an election inspector shall not leave the absent voter counting place after the tallying has begun until the polls 12 13 close. If the election inspectors appointed to an absent voter 14 counting board are authorized to work in shifts, at no time shall 15 there be a gap between shifts and the election inspectors must 16 never leave the absent voter ballots unattended. At all times, at least 1 election inspector from each major political party must be 17 18 present at the absent voter counting place and the policies and 19 procedures adopted by the secretary of state regarding the counting 20 of absent voter ballots must be followed. A person An individual who causes the polls to be closed or who discloses an election 21 22 result or in any manner characterizes how any ballot being counted 23 has been voted in a voting precinct before the time the polls can 24 be legally closed on election day is guilty of a felony. 25 (11) Voted absent voter ballots must be placed in an approved ballot container, and the ballot container must be sealed in the 26 27 manner provided by this act for paper ballot precincts. The seal 28 numbers must be recorded on the statement sheet and in the poll 29 book.

(12) Subject to this subsection, a local election official who 1 has established an absent voter counting board or combined absent 2 3 voter counting board, the deputy or employee of that local election 4 official, an employee of the state bureau of elections, a county 5 clerk, an employee of a county clerk, or a representative of a 6 voting equipment company may enter and leave an absent voter 7 counting board or combined absent voter counting board after the 8 tally has begun but before the polls close, and between 8 a.m. and 9 5 p.m. on any day before election day authorized by a city or 10 township if absent voter counting boards are established to open, 11 process and tabulate absent voter ballots before election day. A person An individual described in this subsection may enter an 12 absent voter counting board or combined absent voter counting board 13 14 only for the purpose of responding to an inquiry from an election 15 inspector or a challenger or providing instructions on the 16 operation of the counting board. Before entering an absent voter 17 counting board or combined absent voter counting board, a person an 18 individual described in this subsection must take and sign the oath prescribed in subsection (9). The chairperson of the absent voter 19 20 counting board or combined absent voter counting board shall record 21 in the poll book the name of a person an individual described in 22 this subsection who enters the absent voter counting board or 23 combined absent voter counting board. A person An individual 24 described in this subsection who enters an absent voter counting 25 board or combined absent voter counting board and who discloses an 26 election result or in any manner characterizes how any ballot being 27 counted has been voted in a precinct before the time the polls can 28 be legally closed on election day is guilty of a felony. As used in 29 this subsection, "local election official" means a county, city, or

1 township clerk.

(13) The secretary of state shall develop instructions consistent with this act for the conduct of absent voter counting boards or combined absent voter counting boards. The secretary of state shall distribute the instructions developed under this subsection to county, city, and township clerks 40 days or more before a general election in which absent voter counting boards or combined absent voter counting boards will be used. A county, city, or township clerk shall make the instructions developed under this subsection available to the public and shall distribute the instructions to each challenger in attendance at an absent voter counting board or combined absent voter counting board. The instructions developed under this subsection are binding upon the operation of an absent voter counting board or combined absent voter counting board used in an election conducted by a county, city, or township. 

(14) No later than 5 days before the first day absent voter ballots can be opened, processed, and tabulated, a city or township that authorizes absent voter counting boards to be established before election day shall provide notice in a newspaper of general circulation in that city or township of the location, dates, and hours the absent voter counting boards will meet before election day. In addition, the notice required under this subsection must state that an absent voter who votes and returns his or her absent voter ballot to the city or township clerk is not permitted to spoil his or her absent voter ballot after the date the absent voter counting boards in that city or township are authorized to meet to open, process, and tabulate absent voter ballots. The city or township shall also provide the notice described in this

- subsection to the county chairperson of each political party where that city or township is located.
- 3 (15) Absent voter counting boards established and authorized
- 4 to meet on days before election day shall meet only between 8 a.m.
- 5 and 5 p.m. on those days authorized by the city or township before
- 6 election day, and shall meet beginning at 7 a.m. on election day.
- 7 Absent voter counting boards established and authorized to meet on
- 8 days before election day are only permitted to open, process, and
- 9 tabulate absent voter ballots and are not permitted to tally or
- 10 count the results of those absent voter ballots. A tabulator used
- 11 in an absent voter counting board before election day must be
- 12 programmed to not reveal any election results until election day.
- 13 Each day before election day, the absent voter ballots that have
- 14 been opened, processed, and tabulated in an absent voter counting
- 15 board must be secured in an approved ballot container and sealed in
- 16 the manner as provided in subsection (11). The ballot container
- 17 must be kept in a secure location until election day.
- 18 Sec. 765b. (1) Not Except as otherwise provided in subsection
- 19 (9), not later than 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before an
- 20 election, an elector may submit a signed, written statement to his
- 21 or her city or township clerk requesting that the clerk do both of
- 22 the following:
- 23 (a) Spoil the elector's absent voter ballot.
- 24 (b) Provide or mail a new absent voter ballot to the elector.
- 25 (2) Upon receipt of a signed, written statement from an
- 26 elector as described in subsection (1), the city or township clerk
- 27 shall mark the absent voter ballot return envelope of that elector
- 28 as "spoiled" and retain the envelope. In addition, the city or
- 29 township clerk shall provide or mail a new absent voter ballot to

- 1 that elector.
- 2 (3) An Except as otherwise provided in subsection (9), an
- 3 elector who has returned an absent voter ballot may, before 10 a.m.

- 4 on the day before an election except Sunday or a legal holiday,
- 5 appear in person at his or her city or township clerk's office to
- 6 do both of the following:
- 7 (a) Spoil his or her absent voter ballot by submitting a
- 8 signed, written statement to the city or township clerk indicating
- 9 that the elector wishes to have his or her absent voter ballot
- 10 spoiled.
- 11 (b) Vote a new absent voter ballot in the clerk's office.
- 12 (4) Upon receipt of the signed, written statement from an
- 13 elector as described in subsection (3)(a), the city or township
- 14 clerk shall mark the absent voter ballot return envelope of that
- 15 elector as "spoiled" and retain the envelope. In addition, the city
- 16 or township clerk shall issue the elector a new absent voter ballot
- 17 that must be voted by the elector in the clerk's office.
- 18 (5) Not later than 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before an
- 19 election, an elector who has lost his or her absent voter ballot or
- 20 not yet received his or her absent voter ballot in the mail may
- 21 submit a signed, written statement to his or her city or township
- 22 clerk requesting that the clerk do both of the following:
- 23 (a) Spoil the elector's absent voter ballot.
- 24 (b) Provide or mail a new absent voter ballot to the elector.
- 25 (6) Upon receipt of a signed, written statement from an
- 26 elector as described in subsection (5), the city or township clerk
- 27 shall indicate in the qualified voter file that the original ballot
- 28 is spoiled. In addition, the city or township clerk shall provide
- 29 or mail a new absent voter ballot to that elector.

- 1 (7) An elector who has lost his or her absent voter ballot or
- 2 not yet received his or her absent voter ballot in the mail may,
- 3 before 4 p.m. on the day before an election except Sunday or a
- 4 legal holiday, appear in person at his or her city or township
- 5 clerk's office to do both of the following:
- 6 (a) Spoil his or her absent voter ballot by submitting a
- 7 signed, written statement to the city or township clerk indicating
- 8 that the elector wishes to have his or her absent voter ballot
- 9 spoiled.
- 10 (b) Vote a new absent voter ballot in the clerk's office.
- 11 (8) Upon receipt of the signed, written statement from an
- 12 elector described in subsection (7)(a), the city or township clerk
- 13 shall indicate in the qualified voter file that the original ballot
- 14 is spoiled. In addition, the city or township clerk shall issue the
- 15 elector a new absent voter ballot that must be voted by the elector
- 16 in the clerk's office.
- 17 (9) If a city or township authorizes that absent voter
- 18 counting boards be established to open, process, and tabulate
- 19 absent voter ballots before election day as provided in section
- 20 765a, an elector who has voted and returned his or her absent voter
- 21 ballot to the city or township clerk is not permitted to spoil his
- 22 or her absent voter ballot after the date absent voter counting
- 23 boards in that city or township are authorized to meet and begin
- 24 opening, processing, and tabulating absent voter ballots.
