- 3 (a) Before the effective date of the amendatory act that added

- 9 (2) This act does not prevent any controlling board from 10 establishing a reasonable policy for retirement to apply equally to 11 all teachers who are eligible for retirement under the public 12 school employees retirement act of 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1301 to 38.1437, or, having established a reasonable retirement age 13 14 policy, from temporarily continuing on a year-to-year basis on 15 criteria equally applied to all teachers the contract of any 16 teacher whom the controlling board might wish to retain beyond the 17 established retirement age for the benefit of the school system.
