THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 6. (1) A public body that is a city, village, township,
- 2 county, or state department, or under the control of a city,

- 4 having an executive form of government, the chairperson of the

- 7 (2) For all other public bodies, the chief administrative
- 8 officer of the respective public body is designated the public
- 9 body's FOIA coordinator.
- 10 (3) An A FOIA coordinator may designate another individual to
- 11 act on his or her behalf in accepting and processing requests for

- 14 (4) A public body shall conspicuously post in a public area of
- 15 its premises at least 1 visually prominent sign on which is printed
- 16 all of the following information:
- 17 (a) Contact information for the public body's FOIA
- 18 coordinator, including his or her name and business telephone
- 19 number, email address, and mailing address.
- 20 (b) The same contact information described in subdivision (a)
- 21 for an individual designated to act on behalf of the public body's
- 22 FOIA coordinator under subsection (3), if a designation has been

- 24 (5) If a public body directly or indirectly maintains an
- 25 official internet presence, it shall, in addition to posting the
- 26 sign described in subsection (4), post and maintain all of the
- 27 information described in subsection (4) on a portion of its website
- 28 that is fully accessible to the public.
