HOUSE BILL NO. 6132

May 24, 2022, Introduced by Rep. Griffin and referred to the Committee on Workforce, Trades, and Talent.

A bill to amend 1943 PA 240, entitled "State employees' retirement act,"

by amending section 68c (MCL 38.68c), as amended by 2020 PA 314.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 68c. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
- 2 subsection (3), a retirant who is receiving a retirement allowance
- 3 under this act and is employed by this state beginning after
- 4 October 1, 2007 the effective date of the 2022 amendatory act that
- 5 amended this sentence agrees to forfeit his or her right to receive
- 6 that retirement allowance during this period of state employment.

- 1 The retirement system shall stop payment of the retirement 2 allowance to a retirant described in this subsection during this period of state employment and shall reinstate payment of the 3 retirement allowance without recalculation when the period of state 4 5 employment ceases. This subsection does not apply to a retirant who 6 is directly or indirectly employed by this state on October 1, 2007 7 while he or she remains in the position held by the retirant on 8 October 1, 2007. As used in this subsection, "employed by this 9 state" means employed directly by this state as an employee, 10 indirectly by this state through a contractual arrangement with 11 other parties, or by engagement of the retirant by this state as an 12 independent contractor. This subsection does not apply to a 13 retirant who is engaged as an independent contractor on October 1, 14 2010 while the retirant remains engaged in the same contract that 15 was held by the retirant on October 1, 2010 without amendment or 16 extension. 17 (2) A hospital, medical-surgical, and sick care benefits plan, 18 dental plan, vision plan, and hearing plan that covers retirants, 19 retirant allowance beneficiaries, former qualified participants, 20 and health benefit dependents under this act must contain a
 - (a) If the person covered under any of the plans is also eligible for Medicare, the benefits under Medicare must be determined before the health insurance benefits under this act.

(b) If a person covered under any of the plans provided by this act is also covered under another plan that contains a coordination of benefits provision, the benefits must be coordinated as provided in the coordination of benefits act, 1984

 - (c) The department of corrections provides written notice to the state budget office and the department of technology, management, and budget that attempts have been made to fill the position through postings and recruitment and that the position vacancy still exists.
 - (d) The department of corrections reports the employment of a retirant under this subsection within 30 days of employment of the retirant to the state budget office and the department of technology, management, and budget. The report must include the name of the retirant, the capacity in which the retirant is employed, and the total compensation paid to the retirant.

 - (4) Subsection (1) does not apply to the appointment of a retirant who retired after a bona fide termination and who was an assistant attorney general as a special assistant attorney general if the attorney general determines that, as a result of his or her

previous employment with this state, the retirant possesses 1 specialized expertise and experience necessary for the appointment 2 and that the appointment is the most cost-effective option for this 3 state. 4 (5) Until September 30, 2015, subsection (1) does not apply to 5 6 a retirant if all of the following apply: 7 (a) The retirant is hired to provide for the custody of individuals under the jurisdiction of the department of 8 9 corrections. 10 (b) The retirant is hired in a position that is limited in 11 term, no benefits are paid, and the pay is not more than 80% of the maximum hourly wage granted to classified civil service employees 12 employed by the department of corrections to perform the same 13 14 duties as the retirant for the fiscal year during which the 15 retirant is employed. 16 (c) The retirant works no more than 1,040 hours in a 12-month 17 period of state employment. (d) The retirant retired after a bona fide termination of 18 19 employment. 20 (6) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of the 21 following apply: (a) The department of attorney general contracts with the 22 23 retirant as a witness, expert, or consultant for litigation involving this state. The contract must provide that the retirant's 24 25 service as a witness, expert, or consultant ends at the conclusion 26 of the litigation. 27 (b) The attorney general determines that, as a result of the retirant's previous employment with this state, the retirant 28

(c) The retirant retired after a bona fide termination of 3 4 employment. 5 (7) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of the 6 following apply: 7 (a) The retirant is hired by the department of natural 8 resources for active wildland fire suppression. 9 (b) There is an immediate continual need for pregualified, 10 skilled, and trained personnel to address wildfire suppression. 11 (c) The retirant works no more than 600 hours in a fiscal 12 vear. (d) The retirant is hired in a position that is limited in 13 14 term, no benefits are paid, and the pay is not more than 70% of the 15 maximum hourly wage granted to classified civil service employees 16 employed by the department of natural resources to perform the same 17 duties as the retirant for the fiscal year during which the 18 retirant is employed. (e) The department of natural resources reports the employment 19 20 of a retirant under this subsection within 30 days after employment 21 and within 30 days after termination of employment or within 30 days after the end of each fiscal year, whichever occurs first, to 22 23 the state budget office and the department of technology, 24 management, and budget. The report required under this subdivision 25 must include the name of the retirant, the capacity in which the
