HOUSE BILL NO. 6247

June 16, 2022, Introduced by Reps. Posthumus, O'Malley and Slagh and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2018 PA 235.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1531. (1) Except as **otherwise** provided in this act, the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
- 3 requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
- 4 teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
- 5 an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an

- endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in anelementary grade in the public schools of the state.
- 3 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
 4 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
 5 certificate to an individual who has passed appropriate
 6 examinations as follows:
- 7 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed the
 8 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
 9 area in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 10 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed,
 11 if it is available, the elementary certification examination, and
 12 has passed the appropriate available subject area examination for
 13 each subject area, if any, in which he or she applies to be
 14 certified.
- 15 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the superintendent of public instruction shall issue a Michigan 16 teaching certificate to an individual holding a certificate from 17 18 another state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher 19 preparation institution who applies for a Michigan teaching 20 certificate only if the individual passes appropriate examinations as follows:meets either of the following requirements, as 21 22 applicable:
 - (a) For a—an individual who holds a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher preparation institution, the individual passes the appropriate examinations as follows:

(i) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass passes the
appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
area in which he or she applies to be certified. The superintendent
of public instruction may accept passage of an equivalent

- 2 meet this requirement.
- 3 (\ddot{u}) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass,
- 4 passes, if it is available, the elementary certification
- 5 examination, and pass passes the appropriate available subject area
- 6 examination for each subject area, if any, in which he or she
- 7 applies to be certified. The superintendent of public instruction
- 8 may accept passage of an equivalent examination approved by the
- 9 superintendent of public instruction to meet 1 or both of these
- 10 requirements.
- 11 (b) For an individual holding a certificate from another
- 12 state, the individual meets all of the following:
- 13 (i) Holds the teaching certificate from an equivalent
- 14 department to the department, as determined by the department, in
- 15 at least 1 other state of the United States.
- 16 (ii) All of the following are met for each certificate
- 17 described in subparagraph (i) that he or she holds:
- 18 (A) The certificate is in good standing.
- (B) There were minimum education requirements and, if
- 20 applicable, work experience in effect for certification in the
- 21 other state, and the other state verifies that he or she met those
- 22 requirements for certification in that state.
- 23 (C) If the other state required an examination for
- 24 certification, he or she passed the examination.
- 25 (iii) Has not had a teaching certificate revoked, and has not
- 26 voluntarily surrendered a teaching certificate, in any other state
- 27 of the United States or a foreign country while under investigation
- 28 for unprofessional conduct.
- 29 (iv) Has not had discipline imposed by an equivalent department

- 1 to the department. If another state of the United States has taken
- 2 disciplinary action against the applicant, the department shall
- 3 determine if the cause for the action was corrected and the matter
- 4 resolved. If the matter has not been resolved by that other state,
- 5 the department shall not issue or deny a certificate until the
- 6 matter is resolved.
- 7 (v) Does not have a complaint, allegation, or investigation
- 8 pending before an equivalent department to the department in
- 9 another state of the United States or a foreign country that
- 10 relates to unprofessional conduct. If the applicant has any
- 11 complaints, allegations, or investigations pending, the department
- 12 shall suspend the application process and shall not issue or deny a
- 13 certificate to the applicant until the complaint, allegation, or
- 14 investigation is resolved.
- 15 (vi) Pays all applicable fees for certification.
- 16 (vii) Is of good moral character.
- 17 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this act, and excluding
- 18 individuals described in subsection (3), the superintendent of
- 19 public instruction shall only issue a teaching certificate to an
- 20 individual who has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
- 21 reading credit requirements established under superintendent of
- 22 public instruction rule. If an individual holds a teaching
- 23 certificate, then beginning July 1, 2009, notwithstanding any rule
- 24 to the contrary, excluding individuals described in subsection (6),
- 25 the superintendent of public instruction shall not advance the
- 26 individual's certification to professional certification unless the
- 27 individual has successfully completed at least a 3-credit course of
- 28 study with appropriate field experiences in the diagnosis and
- 29 remediation of reading disabilities and differentiated instruction.

- 1 To meet this requirement, the course of study should include the
- 2 following elements, as determined by the department to be
- 3 appropriate for the individual's certification level and
- 4 endorsements: interest inventories, English language learning
- 5 screening, visual and auditory discrimination tools, language
- 6 expression and processing screening, phonemics, phonics,
- 7 vocabulary, fluency, comprehension, spelling and writing assessment
- 8 tools, and instructional strategies. An individual may complete the
- 9 course of study either as part of his or her teacher preparation
- 10 program or during the first 6 years of his or her employment in
- 11 classroom teaching.
- 12 (5) Not later than January 11, 2002, the superintendent of
- 13 public instruction, in cooperation with appropriate curriculum
- 14 specialists and teacher educators, shall revise existing reading
- 15 standards to recognize reading disorders and to enable teachers to
- 16 make referrals for instruction and support for pupils with reading
- 17 disorders.
- 18 (6) Subject to subsection $\frac{(8)}{(7)}$, if an individual holding a
- 19 teaching certificate from another state applies to the
- 20 superintendent of public instruction for a Michigan teaching
- 21 certificate and meets the requirements of this subsection, the
- 22 superintendent of public instruction shall issue to the individual
- 23 a Michigan professional education teaching certificate and
- 24 applicable endorsements comparable to those the individual holds in
- 25 the other state. , without requiring the individual to pass the
- 26 applicable subject area examination otherwise required under
- 27 subsection (2) or (3). To be eligible to receive a Michigan
- 28 professional education teaching certificate under this subsection,
- 29 an individual shall provide evidence satisfactory to the department

- 1 that he or she meets all of the following requirements:
- 2 (a) Has Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, has
- 3 taught successfully for at least 3 years 6 months in a position for
- 4 which the individual's teaching certification from the other state
- 5 was valid. This subdivision does not apply to an individual who is
- 6 in the Armed Forces of the United States, who is a veteran, or who
- 7 is the dependent of an individual who is in the Armed Forces of the
- 8 United States or a veteran. As used in this subdivision:
- 9 (i) "Armed Forces of the United States" means the United States
- 10 Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, Space Force, or Coast Guard or
- 11 other military force designated by Congress as part of the Armed
- 12 Forces of the United States, including the reserve components.
- 13 (ii) "Dependent" means a spouse, surviving spouse, child who is
- 14 under 26 years of age, or surviving child who is under 26 years of
- 15 age.
- 16 (iii) "Veteran" means that term as defined in section 1 of 1965
- 17 PA 190, MCL 35.61.
- 18 (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in
- 19 another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned
- 20 course of study at an institution of higher education approved by
- 21 the superintendent of public instruction or has earned, at any
- 22 time, a master's or doctoral degree approved by the superintendent
- 23 of public instruction.
- 24 (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
- 25 reading credit requirement established under superintendent of
- 26 public instruction rule.Meets all of the following:
- 27 (i) Holds the teaching certificate from an equivalent
- 28 department to the department, as determined by the department, in
- 29 at least 1 other state of the United States.

- 1 (ii) All of the following are met for each certificate 2 described in subparagraph (i) that he or she holds:
- 3 (A) The certificate is in good standing.

- 4 (B) There were minimum education requirements and, if
 5 applicable, work experience in effect for certification in the
 6 other state, and the other state verifies that he or she met those
 7 requirements for certification in that state.
- 8 (C) If the other state required an examination for 9 certification, he or she passed the examination.
 - (iii) Has not had a teaching certificate revoked, and has not voluntarily surrendered a teaching certificate, in any other state of the United States or a foreign country while under investigation for unprofessional conduct.
 - (iv) Has not had discipline imposed by an equivalent department to the department. If another state of the United States has taken disciplinary action against the applicant, the department shall determine if the cause for the action was corrected and the matter resolved. If the matter has not been resolved by that other state, the department shall not issue or deny a certificate until the matter is resolved.
 - (v) Does not have a complaint, allegation, or investigation pending before an equivalent department to the department in another state of the United States or a foreign country that relates to unprofessional conduct. If the applicant has any complaints, allegations, or investigations pending, the department shall suspend the application process and shall not issue or deny a certificate to the applicant until the complaint, allegation, or investigation is resolved.
 - (vi) Pays all applicable fees for certification.

(vii) Is of good moral character.

2 (7) An individual who receives a teaching certificate and
3 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (6) is eligible to
4 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to
5 endorsements the individual holds in another state only if the
6 individual passes the appropriate subject area examinations
7 required under subsection (2) or (3).

- (7) (8)—The superintendent of public instruction shall deny a Michigan teaching certificate to an individual described in subsection (6) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or concealment in the individual's application for a certificate or for a conviction for which an individual's teaching certificate may be revoked under section 1535a.
- (8) (9) The department, based upon criteria recommended under subsection (11), (10), shall provide to approved teacher education institutions approved guidelines and criteria for use in the development or selection of subject area examinations.
- (9) (10)—For the purposes of this section, the superintendent of public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under subsection (11), (10), shall develop, select, or develop and select 1 or more subject area examinations. In addition, the superintendent of public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under subsection (11), (10), shall approve an elementary certification examination and a reading subject area examination. If the department develops for use under this subsection an examination that had previously been contracted for using a competitive bid process, then the department shall not expend on the development of that examination an amount that exceeds the amount that the department expended on procurement of

- 1 the most recent competitively-bid version of that examination.
- 2 (10) (11) The superintendent of public instruction shall
- 3 appoint an 11-member teacher examination advisory committee
- 4 composed of representatives of approved teacher education
- 5 institutions and Michigan education organizations and associations.
- **6** Not more than 1/2 of the members comprising this committee shall be
- 7 certified teachers. This committee shall recommend criteria to be
- 8 used by the superintendent of public instruction in the
- 9 development, selection, or development and selection of subject
- 10 area examinations. In addition, the committee shall recommend
- 11 quidelines for the use and administration of those examinations.
- 12 (11) (12)—The superintendent of public instruction shall
- 13 appoint a 7-member standing technical advisory council composed of
- 14 individuals who are experts in measurement and assessment. This
- 15 council shall advise the superintendent of public instruction and
- 16 the teacher examination committee on the validity, reliability, and
- 17 other technical standards of the examinations that will be used or
- 18 are being used and of the administration and use of those
- 19 examinations.
- 20 (12) (13) Not later than November 30 of each year, the
- 21 superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a
- 22 report on the development or selection and use of the elementary
- 23 certification examination and the subject area examinations to the
- 24 house and senate education committees. The report shall must also
- 25 contain a financial statement regarding revenue received from the
- 26 assessment of fees levied under subsection (15)—(14) and the amount
- 27 of and any purposes for which that revenue was expended.
- 28 (13) (14)—The elementary certification examination and the
- 29 subject area examinations required by this section may be taken at

- 1 different times during an approved teacher preparation program, but
- 2 the elementary certification examination and the subject area
- 3 examinations, as applicable, must be passed before an individual is
- 4 recommended for certification.
- 5 (14) (15) The department, or if approved by the superintendent
- 6 of public instruction, a private testing service, may assess fees
- 7 for taking the elementary certification examination and the subject
- 8 area examinations. The fees, which shall must be set by the
- 9 superintendent of public instruction, shall must not exceed the
- 10 actual cost of the examination and of administering the
- 11 examination. Fees received by the department shall be expended
- 12 solely for administrative expenses that it incurs in implementing
- 13 this section. If the superintendent of public instruction increases
- 14 a fee charged for an examination under this subsection, at least 1
- 15 year before implementing the fee increase, the department shall
- 16 notify each approved teacher education institution of the amount of
- 17 the fee increase. An approved teacher education institution shall
- 18 notify each of its affected students of the timing and amount of
- 19 such a fee increase.
- 20 (16) If an individual holding a teaching certificate from
- 21 another state applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets
- 22 all requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except
- 23 passage of the appropriate examinations under subsection (3), the
- 24 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable
- 25 temporary teaching certificate, good for 1 year, to the individual.
- 26 The superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a Michigan
- 27 teaching certificate to the individual after expiration of the
- 28 temporary teaching certificate unless the individual passes
- 29 appropriate examinations as described in subsection (3).

(17) As used in this section: 1 2 (a) "Elementary certification examination" means a 3 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has 4 been developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and 5 6 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary 7 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is 8 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate. 9 (b) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to 10 a specific area of certification, which examination has been 11 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction 12 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and 13 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not 14 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate. 15 (15) (18)—The superintendent of public instruction shall 16 promulgate rules for the implementation of this section. 17 (16) (19) Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of public instruction shall continue to issue state 18 19 elementary or secondary continuing education certificates under R 20 390.1132(1) of the Michigan Administrative Code to individuals who 21 completed the requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and who apply for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994. If 22 the superintendent of public instruction has issued a state 23 24 elementary or secondary professional education certificate to an 25 individual described in this section, the superintendent of public 26 instruction shall consider the individual to have a state 27 elementary or secondary, as applicable, continuing education certificate. 28 29 (17) (20) Not later than January 1, 2019, the superintendent

- 2 talent and economic development labor and economic opportunity and
