## **HOUSE BILL NO. 6387**

September 21, 2022, Introduced by Reps. LaFave, Markkanen and Damoose and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 501 (MCL 324.501).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 501. (1) A department of natural resources for this state
- 2 is created. which shall possess The department of natural resources
- 3 has the powers and shall perform the duties granted and imposed by
- 4 this act and as otherwise provided by law.
- 5 (2) The commission of natural resources is created as the head

- 1 of the department of natural resources and may establish general
- 2 policies related to natural resources management and environmental
- 3 protection for the guidance of the director. In addition, the
- 4 commission has appellate authority as provided in section 1101. The
- 5 commission shall be is composed of 7 members, not as follows:
- 6 (a) No more than 4 of whom shall members may be members of the 7 same political party. 7 appointed by the
- 8 (b) The governor by and shall appoint a member with the advice9 and consent of the senate.
- 10 (c) A member of the commission shall must be selected with
  11 special reference to that person's individual's training and
  12 experience related to at least 1 of the principal lines of
  13 activities vested in the department of natural resources and the
  14 ability and fitness of that person individual to deal with those
  15 activities.
- 16 (d) The term of office of each member of the commission shall
  17 be-is 4 years.
- (e) The governor shall fill a vacancy occurring in themembership of the commission and may remove a member of thecommission for cause after a hearing.

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- (f) Each member of the commission shall hold office until the appointment and qualification of that member's successor.
- (g) Each member appointed to the commission after the effective date of the amendatory act that added this subdivision must have held a hunting or fishing license for no less than 4 out of the 6 years preceding the member's appointment.
- 27 (3) The commission, within 30 days after having qualified and
  28 annually after that time, shall meet at its office in Lansing and
  29 organize by appointing a secretary, who need not be a member of the

- 1 commission. The governor shall appoint a chairperson of the
- 2 commission from among its members, who shall serve as chairperson
- 3 at the pleasure of the governor. Four members of the commission
- 4 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The business

- 7 meetings act, Act No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976, being

- 10 place of the meeting shall must be given in the manner required by
- 11 Act No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976. the open meetings act, 1976
- 12 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275. A meeting may be called by the
- 13 chairperson and shall must be called on request of a majority of
- 14 the members of the commission. A—The commission may hold a meeting
- 15 may be held as often as necessary and at other places than the
- 16 commissioners' offices at Lansing. The commission shall meet at
- 17 least once each month.
- 18 (4) The commission shall appoint and employ a director who
- 19 shall continue in office serves at the pleasure of the commission.

- 21 assistants and employees as are necessary to implement this part
- 22 and any other law of this state affecting the powers and duties of

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duties of the director as prescribed by law shall must be imposed
on and transferred to a deputy director until the vacancy is filled
or the director's inability or absence from the this state ceases.

(5) The compensation of the deputy directors, the assistants, 4 5 and the employees, and the number of assistants and employees, 6 shall be are subject to the approval of the state administrative 7 board. The members of the commission shall not receive compensation 8 under this part, but each member and the other officers and 9 employees of the department of natural resources shall be are 10 entitled to reasonable expenses while traveling in the performance 11 of their duties prescribed by this act. The salaries and expenses 12 authorized under this act shall must be paid out of the state treasury in the same manner as the salaries of other state officers 13 14 and employees are paid. The department of technology, management, 15 and budget shall furnish suitable offices and office equipment, at 16 Lansing, for the use of the department of natural resources. Each member of the commission and the director shall qualify by taking 17 18 and subscribing to the constitutional oath of office prescribed in
