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A bill to amend 1967 PA 281, entitled "Income tax act of 1967,"

(MCL 206.1 to 206.847) by adding section 260.
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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 260. (1) For tax years beginning on and after January 1, 2 2023 and subject to the applicable limitations in this section, a 3 taxpayer may claim a credit against the tax imposed by this part in 4 an amount equal to 50% of the sum of the cash amount and, if food 5 items are contributed in conjunction with a program in which a

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- 1 vendor makes a matching contribution of similar items, the value of
- 2 those food items, the taxpayer contributes during the tax year to a
- 3 shelter for homeless persons, food kitchen, food bank, or other
- 4 entity located in this state, the primary purpose of which is to
- 5 provide overnight accommodation, food, or meals to persons who are
- 6 indigent if a contribution to that entity is tax deductible for the
- 7 donor under the internal revenue code. For a taxpayer other than a
- 8 resident estate or trust, the maximum credit allowed under this
- 9 subsection shall not exceed \$100.00, or \$200.00 for a joint return.
- 10 For a resident estate or trust, the maximum credit allowed under
- 11 this subsection shall not exceed 10% of the taxpayer's tax
- 12 liability for the tax year before claiming any credits allowed by
- 13 this part or \$5,000.00, whichever is less.
- 14 (2) For a resident estate or trust, the amount used to
- 15 calculate the credit under this section shall not have been
- 16 deducted in arriving at federal taxable income.
- 17 (3) If the amount of the credit allowed under this section
- 18 exceeds the tax liability of the taxpayer for the tax year, the
- 19 portion that exceeds the tax liability shall not be refunded.
- 20 (4) An entity may request that the department determine if a
- 21 contribution to that entity qualifies for the credit under this
- 22 section. The department shall make a determination and respond to a
- 23 request no later than 30 days after the department receives the
- 24 request.
