SENATE BILL NO. 582

June 30, 2021, Introduced by Senators WOJNO, POLEHANKI, BULLOCK, CHANG and ALEXANDER and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to prohibit the conducting of research or training on dogs in a manner that causes pain and distress, and certain activities related to that research or training, by an individual employed, contracted, or otherwise directed by a public body; to prescribe civil sanctions; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:

- 1 (a) "Animal control shelter" means that term as defined in 2 section 1 of 1969 PA 287, MCL 287.331.
- 3 (b) "Dog" means a live dog of the species Canis lupus
 4 familiaris.
- (c) "Public body" means this state, a city, village, township,
 county, school district, public college or university, or singlepurpose government agency, or any other body that is created by
 law.
- 9 (d) "Veterinarian" means an individual licensed to practice
 10 veterinary medicine under part 188 of the public health code, 1978
 11 PA 368, MCL 333.18801 to 333.18838.
- Sec. 3. (1) Subject to subsection (3), in carrying out research or training activities by a public body, an individual employed by, contracted by, or otherwise directed to take action on behalf of the public body shall not do either of the following:
- 16 (a) Conduct a research or training activity on a dog in a17 manner that causes pain or distress.
- 18 (b) Breed, purchase, transport, house, feed, or maintain a dog
 19 for use in a research or training activity that causes pain or
 20 distress.
- (2) For purposes of this section, a research or training
 activity causes pain or distress in either of the following
 circumstances:
- (a) The research or training activity would, if it were
 conducted, be reportable to the United States Department of
 Agriculture under 9 CFR 2.36(b)(6) or (7).
- (b) The research or training activity involves a procedure
 that would, in the absence of pain relief, reasonably be expected
 to cause more than slight or momentary pain or distress, such as

- 1 pain in excess of that caused by an injection or other minor
- 2 procedure. A procedure is considered to be a painful procedure even
- 3 if pain relief is administered.
- 4 (3) The prohibition in subsection (1) does not apply under
- 5 either of the following circumstances:
- 6 (a) If a dog owner consents to the use of his or her dog in
- 7 veterinary training or veterinary clinical research involving the
- 8 necessary treatment of an existing disease or ailment.
- **9** (b) The spaying or neutering of a dog by a veterinarian or
- 10 animal control shelter or other training or medical procedures
- 11 commonly performed by an animal control shelter.
- Sec. 5. An individual who violates this act is responsible for
- 13 a civil fine of not less than \$1,000.00 or more than \$5,000.00 for
- 14 each dog that is the subject of a violation for each day that the
- 15 violation continues. The attorney general shall bring a civil
- 16 action to recover the fine described in this section, and costs and
- 17 fees, including attorney fees. A determination of responsibility
- 18 for a violation of this act does not preclude a conviction,
- 19 sentence, or determination of responsibility for a violation of any
- 20 other law of this state arising from the same conduct.
