## **SENATE BILL NO. 966**

March 17, 2022, Introduced by Senator THEIS and referred to the Committee on Elections.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 5090 and 510 (MCL 168.5090 and 168.510), section 5090 as amended by 2018 PA 126.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 5090. (1) The secretary of state shall direct and

2 supervise the establishment and maintenance of a statewide

- 1 qualified voter file. The secretary of state shall establish the
- 2 technology to implement the qualified voter file. The qualified
- 3 voter file is the official file for the conduct of all elections
- 4 held in this state. The secretary of state may direct that all or
- 5 any part of the city or township **voter** registration files must be
- 6 used in conjunction with the qualified voter file at the first
- 7 state primary and election held after the creation of the qualified
- 8 voter file.
- 9 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
- 10 contrary, an individual who appears to vote in an election and
- 11 whose name appears in the qualified voter file for that city,
- 12 township, or school district is considered a registered voter of
- 13 that city, township, or school district under this act.
- 14 (3) The secretary of state, a designated voter registration
- 15 agency, or a county, city, or township clerk shall not place a name
- 16 of an individual into the qualified voter file unless that
- 17 individual signs an application as prescribed in section 509r(3).
- 18 The secretary of state or a designated voter registration agency
- 19 shall not allow an individual to indicate a different address than
- 20 the address in either the secretary of state's or designated voter
- 21 registration agency's files to be placed in the qualified voter
- **22** file.
- 23 (4) The secretary of state shall develop and utilize a process
- 24 by which information obtained through the United States Social
- 25 Security Administration's death master file that is used to cancel
- 26 an operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan
- 27 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, or an official
- 28 state personal identification card issued under 1972 PA 222, MCL
- 29 28.291 to 28.300, of a deceased resident of this state is also used

- 1 at least once a month to update the qualified voter file to cancel
- 2 the voter registration of any elector determined to be deceased.
- 3 The secretary of state shall make the canceled voter registration
- 4 information under this subsection available to the clerk of each
- 5 county, city, or township to assist with the clerk's obligations
- 6 under section 510.
- 7 (5) Subject to this subsection, the secretary of state shall
- 8 participate with other states in 1 or more recognized multistate
- 9 programs or services, if available, to assist in the verification
- 10 of the current residence and voter registration status of electors.
- 11 The secretary of state shall not participate in any recognized
- 12 multistate program or service described in this subsection that
- 13 requires this state to promote or adopt legislation as a condition
- 14 of participation in that program or service. In addition, the
- 15 secretary of state shall not participate in any recognized
- 16 multistate program or service described in this subsection if the
- 17 secretary of state determines that data of that program or service
- 18 are not being adequately secured or protected. The secretary of
- 19 state shall follow the procedures under section 509aa(5) with
- 20 regard to any electors affected by information obtained through any
- 21 multistate program or service.
- 22 Sec. 510. (1) At—Except as otherwise provided in subsection
- 23 (5), at least once a month, the and not later than the second
- 24 business day of each month, each county clerk shall forward a list
- 25 of the last known address and birth date update the qualified voter
- 26 file to cancel the voter registration of all persons—individuals
- 27 over 18 years of age who have died within in the county. to the
- 28 clerk of each city or township within the county. The
- 29 (2) Each time a county clerk updates the qualified voter file

- 1 under subsection (1) or (5), the secretary of state shall send an
- 2 electronic notification to the appropriate city or township clerk
- 3 regarding each canceled voter registration in that city or
- 4 township.
- 5 (3) Upon receiving an electronic notification under subsection
- 6 (2), the city or township clerk shall compare this list the
- 7 electronic notification with the voter registration records in that
- 8 city or township and cancel complete the cancellation of the voter
- 9 registration of all each deceased electors.elector in that city or
- 10 township.
- 11 (4) If the secretary of state updates the qualified voter file
- 12 to cancel the voter registration of any deceased elector, the
- 13 secretary of state shall send an electronic notification to the
- 14 appropriate city or township clerk regarding each canceled voter
- 15 registration in that city or township. The secretary of state shall
- 16 notify each appropriate city or township clerk of any voter
- 17 registration that needs to be canceled after 4 p.m. on the day
- 18 before an election so that the city or township clerk can cancel
- 19 the voter registration.
- 20 (5) Beginning 45 days before an election and continuing until
- 21 16 days before an election, each county clerk shall update the
- 22 qualified voter file by the close of business each Friday before
- 23 the election to cancel the voter registration of all individuals
- 24 over 18 years of age who have died in the county. Beginning 15 days
- 25 before an election and continuing until the day before an election,
- 26 each county clerk shall update the qualified voter file by the
- 27 close of business each business day before the election to cancel
- 28 the voter registration of all individuals over 18 years of age who
- 29 have died in the county. Each county clerk shall notify each

- 1 appropriate city or township clerk in the county of any voter
- 2 registration that needs to be canceled after 4 p.m. on the day
- 3 before an election so that the city or township clerk can cancel
- 4 the voter registration.
- 5 (6) At least once a month, the secretary of state shall post
- 6 on the department of state website the total number of voter
- 7 registrations canceled, broken down by all of the following:
- 8 (a) Month and year.
- 9 (b) County.
- 10 (c) City and township.
