## **SENATE BILL NO. 1010**

April 19, 2022, Introduced by Senator THEIS and referred to the Committee on Education and Career Readiness.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2018 PA 235.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1531. (1) Except as **otherwise** provided in this act, the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
- 3 requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
- 4 teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
- 5 an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an
- 6 endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in an

- 1 elementary grade in the public schools of the this state.
- 2 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 3 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
- 4 certificate to an individual who has passed appropriate
- 5 examinations as follows:
- 6 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed the
- 7 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
- 8 area in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 9 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed,
- 10 if it is available, the elementary certification examination, and
- 11 has passed the appropriate available subject area examination for
- 12 each subject area, if any, in which he or she applies to be
- 13 certified.
- 14 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 15 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a Michigan
- 16 teaching certificate to an individual holding a certificate from
- 17 another state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state teacher
- 18 preparation institution who applies for a Michigan teaching
- 19 certificate only if the individual passes appropriate examinations
- 20 as follows:
- 21 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass the
- 22 appropriate available subject area examination for each subject
- 23 area in which he or she applies to be certified. The superintendent
- 24 of public instruction may accept passage of an equivalent
- 25 examination approved by the superintendent of public instruction to
- 26 meet this requirement.
- 27 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass, if it
- 28 is available, the elementary certification examination, and pass
- 29 the appropriate available subject area examination for each subject

- 1 area, if any, in which he or she applies to be certified. The
- 2 superintendent of public instruction may accept passage of an
- 3 equivalent examination approved by the superintendent of public
- 4 instruction to meet 1 or both of these requirements.
- 5 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 6 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching
- 7 certificate to an individual who has met the elementary or
- 8 secondary, as applicable, reading credit requirements established
- 9 under superintendent of public instruction rule. If an individual
- 10 holds a teaching certificate, then beginning July 1, 2009,
- 11 notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the superintendent of
- 12 public instruction shall not advance the individual's certification
- 13 to professional certification unless the individual has
- 14 successfully completed at least a 3-credit course of study with
- 15 appropriate field experiences in the diagnosis and remediation of
- 16 reading disabilities and differentiated instruction. To meet this
- 17 requirement, the course of study should include the following
- 18 elements, as determined by the department to be appropriate for the
- 19 individual's certification level and endorsements: interest
- 20 inventories, English language learning screening, visual and
- 21 auditory discrimination tools, language expression and processing
- 22 screening, phonemics, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, comprehension,
- 23 spelling and writing assessment tools, and instructional
- 24 strategies. An individual may complete the course of study either
- 25 as part of his or her teacher preparation program or during the
- 26 first 6 years of his or her employment in classroom teaching.
- 27 (5) Not later than January 11, 2002, the superintendent of
- 28 public instruction, in cooperation with appropriate curriculum
- 29 specialists and teacher educators, shall revise existing reading

- 1 standards to recognize reading disorders and to enable teachers to
- 2 make referrals for instruction and support for pupils with reading
- 3 disorders.
- 4 (6) Subject to subsection (8) and except as otherwise provided
- 5 in this section, if an individual holding a teaching certificate
- 6 from another state applies to the superintendent of public
- 7 instruction for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets the
- 8 requirements of this subsection, the superintendent of public
- 9 instruction shall issue to the individual a Michigan professional
- 10 education teaching certificate and applicable endorsements
- 11 comparable to those the individual holds in the other state,
- 12 without requiring the individual to pass the applicable subject
- 13 area examination otherwise required under subsection (2) or (3). extstyle extst
- 14 Except as otherwise provided in this section, to be eligible to
- 15 receive a Michigan professional education teaching certificate
- 16 under this subsection, an individual shall provide evidence
- 17 satisfactory to the department that he or she meets all of the
- 18 following requirements:
- 19 (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a position
- 20 for which the individual's teaching certification from the other
- 21 state was valid.
- 22 (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in
- 23 another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned
- 24 course of study at an institution of higher education approved by
- 25 the superintendent of public instruction or has earned, at any
- 26 time, a master's or doctoral degree approved by the superintendent
- 27 of public instruction.
- (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
- 29 reading credit requirement established under superintendent of

- 1 public instruction rule.
- 2 (7) An individual who receives a teaching certificate and
- 3 endorsement or endorsements under subsection (6) is eligible to
- 4 receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to
- 5 endorsements the individual holds in another state only if the
- 6 individual passes the appropriate subject area examinations
- 7 required under subsection (2) or (3).
- 8 (8) The superintendent of public instruction shall deny a
- 9 Michigan teaching certificate to an individual described in
- 10 subsection (6) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or
- 11 concealment in the individual's application for a certificate or
- 12 for a conviction for which an individual's teaching certificate may
- 13 be revoked under section 1535a.
- 14 (9) The department, based upon criteria recommended under
- 15 subsection (11), shall provide to approved teacher education
- 16 institutions approved guidelines and criteria for use in the
- 17 development or selection of subject area examinations.
- 18 (10) For the purposes of this section, the superintendent of
- 19 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under
- 20 subsection (11), shall develop, select, or develop and select 1 or
- 21 more subject area examinations. In addition, the superintendent of
- 22 public instruction, based upon criteria recommended under
- 23 subsection (11), shall approve an elementary certification
- 24 examination and a reading subject area examination. If the
- 25 department develops for use under this subsection an examination
- 26 that had previously been contracted for using a competitive bid
- 27 process, then the department shall not expend on the development of
- 28 that examination an amount that exceeds the amount that the
- 29 department expended on procurement of the most recent

- 1 competitively-bid version of that examination.
- 2 (11) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint an
- 3 11-member teacher examination advisory committee composed of
- 4 representatives of approved teacher education institutions and
- 5 Michigan education organizations and associations. Not more than
- 6 1/2 of the members comprising this committee shall must be
- 7 certified teachers. This committee shall recommend criteria to be
- 8 used by the superintendent of public instruction in the
- 9 development, selection, or development and selection of subject
- 10 area examinations. In addition, the committee shall recommend
- 11 guidelines for the use and administration of those examinations.
- 12 (12) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a
- 13 7-member standing technical advisory council composed of
- 14 individuals who are experts in measurement and assessment. This
- 15 council shall advise the superintendent of public instruction and
- 16 the teacher examination committee on the validity, reliability, and
- 17 other technical standards of the examinations that will be used or
- 18 are being used and of the administration and use of those
- 19 examinations.
- 20 (13) Not later than November 30 of each year, the
- 21 superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a
- 22 report on the development or selection and use of the elementary
- 23 certification examination and the subject area examinations to the
- 24 house and senate education committees. The report shall must also
- 25 contain a financial statement regarding revenue received from the
- 26 assessment of fees levied under subsection (15) and the amount of
- 27 and any purposes for which that revenue was expended.
- 28 (14) The elementary certification examination and the subject
- 29 area examinations required by this section may be taken at

- 1 different times during an approved teacher preparation program, but
- 2 the elementary certification examination and the subject area
- 3 examinations, as applicable, must be passed before an individual is
- 4 recommended for certification.
- 5 (15) The department, or if approved by the superintendent of
- 6 public instruction, a private testing service, may assess fees for
- 7 taking the elementary certification examination and the subject
- 8 area examinations. The fees, which shall must be set by the
- 9 superintendent of public instruction, shall must not exceed the
- 10 actual cost of the examination and of administering the
- 11 examination. Fees received by the department shall must be expended
- 12 solely for administrative expenses that it incurs in implementing
- 13 this section. If the superintendent of public instruction increases
- 14 a fee charged for an examination under this subsection, at least 1
- 15 year before implementing the fee increase, the department shall
- 16 notify each approved teacher education institution of the amount of
- 17 the fee increase. An approved teacher education institution shall
- 18 notify each of its affected students of the timing and amount of
- 19 such a fee increase.
- 20 (16) If Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, if an
- 21 individual holding a teaching certificate from another state
- 22 applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets all
- 23 requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except passage
- 24 of the appropriate examinations under subsection (3), the
- 25 superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable
- 26 temporary teaching certificate, good for 1 year, to the individual.
- 27 If an individual who holds a teaching certificate from another
- 28 state applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets all of
- 29 the requirements under subsection (20), except subsection (20)(c),

- 1 the superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable
- 2 temporary teaching certification, good for 1 year, to the
- 3 individual. The superintendent of public instruction shall not
- 4 issue a Michigan teaching certificate to the individual after
- 5 expiration of the temporary teaching certificate unless the
- 6 individual passes appropriate examinations as described in
- 7 subsection (3).
- 8 (17) As used in this section:
- 9 (a) "Elementary certification examination" means a
- 10 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has
- 11 been developed or selected by the superintendent of public
- 12 instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 13 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary
- 14 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is
- 15 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.
- 16 (b) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to
- 17 a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 18 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 19 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 20 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not
- 21 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
- 22 (17) (18) The superintendent of public instruction shall
- 23 promulgate rules for the implementation of this section.
- 24 (18) (19) Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, the
- 25 superintendent of public instruction shall continue to issue state
- 26 elementary or secondary continuing education certificates under R
- 27 390.1132(1) of the Michigan Administrative Code to individuals who
- 28 completed the requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and
- 29 who apply for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994. If

- 1 the superintendent of public instruction has issued a state
- 2 elementary or secondary professional education certificate to an
- 3 individual described in this section, the superintendent of public
- 4 instruction shall consider the individual to have a state
- 5 elementary or secondary, as applicable, continuing education
- 6 certificate.
- 7 (19) (20) Not later than January 1, 2019, the superintendent
- 8 of public instruction, in consultation with the department of
- 9 talent and economic development labor and economic opportunity and
- 10 groups or individuals representing employers, economic development
- 11 agencies, trade unions, secondary school principals, middle and
- 12 elementary school principals, teachers, school district and
- 13 intermediate school district superintendents, and others as
- 14 determined appropriate by the department, shall promulgate rules to
- 15 allow an individual to use time spent engaging with local employers
- 16 or technical centers toward the renewal of a teaching certificate
- 17 in the same manner as state continuing education or professional
- 18 development.
- 19 (20) The superintendent of public instruction shall issue a
- 20 teaching certificate to an individual who applies for a teaching
- 21 certificate, who meets the requirements under section 1531d, as
- 22 applicable, and who meets all of the following requirements:
- (a) Has earned a bachelor's degree from a degree- or
- 24 certificate-granting public or private college or university,
- 25 junior college, or community college located within the United
- 26 States.
- 27 (b) Has a Montessori teaching credential issued by any of the
- 28 following:
- 29 (i) A program accredited by the Montessori Accreditation

- 1 Council for Teacher Education (MACTE).
- 2 (ii) The American Montessori Society (AMS).
- 3 (iii) The Association Montessori International (AMI).
- 4 (c) Subject to subsection (16), has passed the required
- 5 examinations under subsection (2) or (3), as applicable, or, for an
- 6 individual described in subsection (6), for the issuance of a
- 7 Michigan professional education teaching certificate, meets the
- 8 requirements under subsection (6).
- 9 (d) Meets the requirements under subsection (4).
- 10 (21) Subject to subsection (16), the superintendent of public
- 11 instruction shall not, as a condition for the issuance of a
- 12 teaching certificate to an individual described in subsection (20)
- 13 who meets the requirements under section 1531d, as applicable, and
- 14 subsection (20), require that the individual meet requirements in
- 15 addition to the requirements under section 1531d and subsection
- 16 (20).
- 17 (22) As used in this section:
- 18 (a) "Elementary certification examination" means a
- 19 comprehensive examination for elementary certification that has
- 20 been developed or selected by the superintendent of public
- 21 instruction for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 22 understanding of the core subjects normally taught in elementary
- 23 classrooms and for determining whether or not an applicant is
- 24 eligible for an elementary level teaching certificate.
- 25 (b) "Subject area examination" means an examination related to
- 26 a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 27 developed or selected by the superintendent of public instruction
- 28 for the purpose of demonstrating the applicant's knowledge and
- 29 understanding of the subject matter and determining whether or not

1 an applicant is eligible for a Michigan teaching certificate.
