## **SENATE BILL NO. 1193**

September 28, 2022, Introduced by Senator STAMAS and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 2011 PA 152, entitled "Publicly funded health insurance contribution act," by amending section 3 (MCL 15.563), as amended by 2018 PA 477.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this act and
- 2 subject to subsections (2) to (4), a public employer that offers or
- 3 contributes to a medical benefit plan for its employees or elected
- 4 public officials shall pay no more of the annual costs or
- 5 illustrative rate and any payments for reimbursement of co-pays,

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- 1 deductibles, or payments into health savings accounts, flexible
- 2 spending accounts, or similar accounts used for health care costs,
- 3 than a total amount equal to \$5,500.00 times the number of
- 4 employees and elected public officials with single-person coverage,
- 5 \$11,000.00 times the number of employees and elected public
- 6 officials with individual-and-spouse coverage or individual-plus-1-
- 7 nonspouse-dependent coverage, plus \$15,000.00 times the number of
- 8 employees and elected public officials with family coverage, for a
- 9 medical benefit plan coverage year beginning on or after January 1,
- 10 2012. A public employer may allocate its payments for medical
- 11 benefit plan costs among its employees and elected public officials
- 12 as it sees fit. By October 1 of each year after 2011 and before
- 13 2019, the state treasurer shall adjust the maximum payment
- 14 permitted under this subsection for each coverage category for
- 15 medical benefit plan coverage years beginning the succeeding
- 16 calendar year, based on the change in the medical care component of
- 17 the United States Consumer Price Index for the most recent 12-month
- 18 period for which data are available from the United States
- 19 Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. By April 1 of each
- 20 year after 2018, the state treasurer shall adjust the maximum
- 21 payment permitted under this subsection for each coverage category
- 22 for medical benefit plan coverage years beginning the succeeding
- 23 calendar year, based on the change in the medical care component of
- 24 the United States Consumer Price Index for the most recent 12-month
- 25 period for which data are available from the United States
- 26 Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- 27 (2) For Subject to subsection (3), for a medical benefit plan
- 28 coverage year beginning January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014,
- 29 the multiplier used to calculate the maximum public employer

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- 1 payment under subsection (1) is \$12,250.00 for employees and
- 2 elected public officials with individual-and-spouse coverage or
- 3 individual-plus-1-nonspouse-dependent coverage. The state treasurer

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- 4 shall adjust the multiplier each year as provided in subsection
- **5** (1).
- 6 (3) Subject to subsection (4), for a medical benefit plan
- 7 coverage year beginning on or after January 1, 2023, the
- 8 multipliers used to calculate the maximum public employer payment
- 9 under subsection (1) are as follows:
- 10 (a) \$7,743.00 times the number of employees and elected public
- 11 officials with single-person coverage.
- 12 (b) \$16,193.00 for employees and elected public officials with
- 13 individual-and-spouse coverage or individual-plus-1-nonspouse-
- 14 dependent coverage.
- 15 (c) \$21,116.00 times the number of employees and elected
- 16 public officials with family coverage.
- 17 (4) By April 1 of each year after 2022, the state treasurer
- 18 shall adjust the multipliers for medical benefit plan coverage
- 19 years beginning the succeeding calendar year, based on the change
- 20 in the medical care component of the United States Consumer Price
- 21 Index for the most recent 12-month period for which data are
- 22 available from the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of
- 23 Labor Statistics.
- 24 (5) (3) For purposes of calculating a public employer's
- 25 maximum total annual medical benefit plan costs under subsection
- 26 (1), "employee or elected public official" does not include an
- 27 employee or elected public official who declines the medical
- 28 benefit plan offered or contributed to by the public employer.
