## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 13

Rep. Aiyash offered the following concurrent resolution: 1 A concurrent resolution to call on the state of Michigan to act quickly to replace lead service lines that have contaminated 2 3 drinking water sources in the city of Hamtramck. Whereas, A reliable system that delivers safe, quality 4 5 drinking water is crucial to a community's vitality and its residents' health and well-being; and 6 Whereas, Exposure to lead can cause serious harm to the health 7 of children and adults. Children are especially vulnerable to lead 8 poisoning and can experience damage to the brain and nervous 9 10 system, slowed growth and development, and other significant harm to their health, including long-term impacts; and 11 Whereas, The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's 90th 12 13 percentile value lead action level in drinking water is 15 parts 14 per billion (ppb); and

Whereas, An October 15, 2021, letter from the Department of 1 Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy to Hamtramck about lead and 2 copper monitoring indicates that the community water supply's 90th 3 percentile value exceeded the 15 ppb lead action level during 4 testing from June 1 to September 30, 2021. The 90th percentile value 5 6 for lead was 17 ppb, with sample results reaching as high as 36 ppb. Among the sources of the lead contamination, the letter notes 8 that the city's service lines may contain lead; now, therefore, be 9 it. 10 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate 11 concurring), That we call on the state of Michigan to act quickly to replace lead service lines that have contaminated drinking water 12 sources in the city of Hamtramck; and be it further 13 14 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the 15 Governor and the Director of the Department of Environment, Great
