SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3

Senators Hollier and Geiss offered the following concurrent resolution:

A concurrent resolution to condemn the attempted coup to 2 overturn the 2020 presidential election at the U.S. Capitol and state emphatically that there is no place for further undermining 3 4 the 2020 November election with baseless conspiracy theories. Whereas, The peaceful transfer of power is a cornerstone of 5 the United States of America. The fabric of our democracy, 6 stability of our country, and continued progress of our nation 7 8 require adherence to this principle; and 9 Whereas, On January 6, 2021, in what is usually a ceremonial affair, a joint session of Congress gathered to count the Electoral 10 11 College votes and affirm the victory of Joe Biden as president was 12 interrupted by a group of terrorists looking to take control of the

U.S. Capitol Building. The insurrection resulted in the deaths of

- 1 five people, including an officer of the U.S. Capitol Police.
- 2 Moreover, dozens of U.S. Capitol Police officers and others were
- 3 injured. The violence also left a wake of damage and destruction in
- 4 our hallowed Capitol; and
- 5 Whereas, At a political rally earlier on that day, President
- 6 Donald Trump, who has continually sought to invalidate our duly
- 7 held election, encouraged attendees to march to the U.S. Capitol
- 8 Building in protest of the Electoral College vote certification.
- 9 The inflammatory speech included false claims of voter fraud in
- 10 Michigan, with an eye toward wrongly challenging the clear and
- 11 convincing decision of Michigan voters to award the state's
- 12 electoral votes to Joe Biden. In this rally and throughout past
- 13 rallies, President Trump's harmful rhetoric and unsubstantiated,
- 14 conspiratorial allegations of election fraud and irregularities
- 15 have provided fuel for hate and violence; and
- 16 Whereas, Leaders across the country must unite to denounce the
- 17 terror brought to our Capitol and move the country forward
- 18 peacefully; now, therefore, be it
- 19 Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives
- 20 concurring), That we condemn the attempted coup to overturn the
- 21 2020 presidential election at the U.S. Capitol and state
- 22 emphatically that there is no place for further undermining the
- 23 2020 November election with baseless conspiracy theories; and be it

- 25 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 26 President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United
- 27 States House of Representatives, and the members of the Michigan
- 28 congressional delegation.
