

## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 16

Senator MacDonald offered the following concurrent resolution:

1       A concurrent resolution to urge the forgiveness of all fines  
2 and fees imposed on and the end to all prosecutions brought against  
3 businesses for violating COVID-19 orders or rules.

4       Whereas, The COVID-19 Pandemic has brought unprecedented  
5 challenges to Michigan. Faced with twin economic and public health  
6 crises, difficult decisions were required to protect the lives and  
7 livelihood of Michigan residents; and

8       Whereas, In order to mitigate the virus' spread, executive  
9 orders and emergency rules were issued placing restrictions on  
10 business operations, including temporary closures and capacity  
11 restrictions, resulting in penalties imposed on businesses.  
12 Hundreds of businesses have been cited for violations of these  
13 restrictions, resulting in thousands of dollars in fines and fees.  
14 Some business owners have even been prosecuted for violations; and

1       Whereas, Penalties for violations of COVID-19 restrictions  
2 should be waived or forgiven. Business owners have been under  
3 immense pressure and encountered daunting challenges during the  
4 Pandemic, with many facing the possibility of losing their life's  
5 work or family business through no fault of their own. These  
6 individuals did the best they could to keep employees and customers  
7 safe while continuing to operate. It is not right to force these  
8 individuals to pay for mistakes made under these impossible  
9 circumstances; and

10       Whereas, It is in Michigan's interest to ensure that  
11 businesses are in the best position to emerge from the Pandemic  
12 fiscally healthy. Waiving COVID-19 related fines and fees will  
13 provide some financial relief and allow these businesses to fully  
14 contribute to our state's economic resurgence; now, therefore, be  
15 it

16       Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives  
17 concurring), That we urge the Governor, the Michigan Department of  
18 Health and Human Services, and the Michigan Department of Licensing  
19 and Regulatory Affairs to forgive all fines and fees accrued by  
20 businesses for violating COVID-19 orders or rules; and be it  
21 further

22       Resolved, That we urge the Michigan Attorney General to halt  
23 all prosecutions related to violations of COVID-19 orders or rules;  
24 and be it further

25       Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the  
26 Governor of Michigan, the Attorney General of Michigan, the  
27 Director of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services,  
28 and the Director of the Michigan Department of Licensing and  
29 Regulatory Affairs.
