

## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 68

Reps. Witwer, Manoogian, Puri, Haadsma, Tyrone Carter, Steenland, Peterson, Allor, Breen, Brixie, Calley, Cherry, Clemente, Garza, Hope, Kahle, Kuppa, Morse, Rendon, Rogers, Sabo, Shannon, Sneller, Sowerby, Stone and Weiss offered the following resolution:

1       A resolution to declare March 29, 2021, as Vietnam Veterans  
2 Day in the state of Michigan.

3       Whereas, Vietnam Veterans Day commemorates the sacrifices of  
4 Vietnam veterans and their families; and

5       Whereas, The Vietnam War was fought in Vietnam from 1955-1975,  
6 and involved North Vietnam and the Viet Cong in conflict with the  
7 United States Armed Forces and South Vietnam; and

8       Whereas, The United States became involved by serving in an  
9 advisory role in South Vietnam in 1955; and

10       Whereas, In 1965, United States Armed Forces ground combat

1 units arrived in Vietnam. In 1969, troop numbers peaked at  
2 approximately 500,000 troops. Michigan residents joined the rest of  
3 the nation, serving our country and our state with honor in  
4 Vietnam; and

5       Whereas, On January 27, 1973, the Treaty of Paris was signed  
6 which required the release of all United States prisoners-of-war  
7 held in North Vietnam and the withdrawal of all United States Armed  
8 Forces from South Vietnam. By March 29, 1973, the United States  
9 Armed Forces completed the withdrawal of combat troops from  
10 Vietnam; and

11       Whereas, More than 58,000 members of the United States Armed  
12 Forces lost their lives in Vietnam and more than 300,000 members of  
13 the Armed Forces were wounded. More than 2,650 Michigan residents  
14 lost their lives in the Vietnam War; and

15       Whereas, It was not until 1982 that the Vietnam Veterans  
16 Memorial was dedicated in Washington, D.C. to commemorate those  
17 members of the United States Armed Forces who died or were declared  
18 missing-in-action in Vietnam; and

19       Whereas, Members of the United States Armed Forces who served  
20 bravely and faithfully for the United States during the Vietnam War  
21 were caught upon their return home in the crossfire of public  
22 debate about the involvement of the United States in the Vietnam  
23 War; and

24       Whereas, March 29 marks the anniversary of the day that combat  
25 and combat support units withdrew completely from South Vietnam;  
26 and

27       Whereas, The members of the Michigan House of Representatives  
28 support the establishment of a Vietnam Veterans Day as an  
29 appropriate way to honor those members of the United States Armed

1 Forces who served in Vietnam during the Vietnam War and more than  
2 200,000 Vietnam Veterans living in Michigan; now, therefore, be it

3 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of  
4 this legislative body declare March 29, 2021, as Vietnam Veterans  
5 Day; and be it further

6 Resolved, That all citizens of the state of Michigan are  
7 encouraged to honor our Vietnam veterans.
