## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.125

Reps. Alexander, Lightner, Breen, Clemente, Garza, Haadsma, Morse, Sabo, Sneller, Thanedar, Weiss, Yaroch and Young offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare June 9, 2021, as 102nd United States
- 2 Colored Troops Day in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, The 102nd United States Colored Troops honorably and
- 4 courageously served the United States and the state of Michigan
- 5 during the Civil War; and
- 6 Whereas, The 102nd United States Colored Troops was Michigan's
- 7 only black regiment in the war. Many of its soldiers were former
- 8 slaves who had escaped to freedom; and
- **9** Whereas, The unit was formed in 1863 as the First Michigan
- 10 Colored Infantry Regiment. Although Michigan's white regiments
- 11 retained their state designation, the First Michigan Colored

- 1 Infantry was renamed the 102nd United States Colored Troops when it
- 2 began federal service in 1864; and
- 3 Whereas, The men of the 102nd United States Colored Troops and
- 4 other black regiments served nobly despite the disparate treatment
- 5 they received compared to white regiments. White soldiers were
- 6 provided with enlistment bonuses, higher pay, and better equipment,
- 7 while white officers were appointed to command black units; and
- 8 Whereas, Black regiments were generally assigned non-combat
- 9 duties, such as the construction of fortifications or the
- 10 destruction of Confederate railroads, but the 102nd United States
- 11 Colored Troops also fought bravely in battle when opportunities
- 12 arose; and
- 13 Whereas, The soldiers of the 102nd United States Colored
- 14 Troops put their lives on the line to save the Union, an effort
- 15 that ushered in the ratification of the Thirteenth Amendment to the
- 16 United States Constitution and the abolition of legalized slavery
- 17 across the nation; and
- 18 Whereas, Michigan's Governor and Legislature unanimously
- 19 recognized the 102nd United States Colored Troops with the
- 20 enactment of Public Act 494 of 2014, which designated the portion
- 21 of Interstate 375 within Wayne County as the "102nd United States
- 22 Colored Troops (U.S.C.T.) Memorial Highway" in honor of the
- 23 regiment; and
- 24 Whereas, The state of Michigan preserves battle flags carried
- 25 by Michigan troops, including flags used by the 102nd United States
- 26 Colored Troops. Flag replicas are displayed in the state Capitol
- 27 rotunda; and
- 28 Whereas, A prominent young citizen of Jackson, Michigan, has
- 29 led fundraising efforts for the installation of signs denoting the

- 1 102nd United States Colored Troops Memorial Highway, as well as for
- 2 conservation and a replica of a battle flag presented to the 102nd
- 3 United States Colored Troops in 1864 by the Colored Ladies Aid
- 4 Society of Detroit; and
- 5 Whereas, The heroism and sacrifice of the soldiers of the
- 6 102nd United States Colored Troops are worthy of our deepest
- 7 gratitude and emulation; now, therefore, be it
- 8 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 9 this legislative body declare June 9, 2021, as 102nd United States
- 10 Colored Troops Day in the state of Michigan.
