

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.211

1 A resolution to declare January 11, 2022, as Human Trafficking
2 Awareness Day in the state of Michigan.

3 Whereas, Human trafficking is a modern-day form of slavery
4 involving the illegal trade of people for exploitation or
5 commercial gain; and

6 Whereas, Human trafficking is one of the fastest-growing
7 crimes in the world, second only to drug trafficking as the most

1 profitable form of crime, according to the U.S. Department of
2 State; and

3 Whereas, The best estimates indicate that approximately \$87
4 million per day is made off of sex trafficking victims; and

5 Whereas, Michigan gained national attention at both the state
6 and federal levels after passing effective legislation in 2013 and
7 2014 to help combat human trafficking and strengthen victim rights,
8 and was named the most improved state in 2015 for its laws
9 addressing child sex trafficking, according to Shared Hope
10 International. Michigan has gone from a rating of "F" in 2011, to a
11 "B" rating in 2019 according to Shared Hope International's
12 Protected Innocence Challenge study. While this state has made
13 considerable advances in fighting against human trafficking, we all
14 must understand that there is still work to be done; and

15 Whereas, This legislative body encourages all Michiganders to
16 educate themselves about human trafficking and be aware of how
17 prevalent it is in our state; and

18 Whereas, We support victims of human trafficking who have yet
19 to escape or be liberated and offer the gravest concern for those
20 who have had loved ones become victims to human trafficking; and

21 Whereas, We commend the individuals who have been victims of
22 trafficking, survived, and have overcome the atrocity, and continue
23 to support all who have dedicated themselves to putting an end to
24 human trafficking in Michigan; now, therefore, be it

25 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
26 this legislative body declare January 11, 2022, as Human
27 Trafficking Awareness Day in the state of Michigan.
