HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.287

Reps. Glenn, Breen, Tyrone Carter, Cavanagh, Garza, Haadsma, Marino, Morse, Sneller, Steenland, Thanedar and Weiss offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare May 2022 as Huntington's Disease
- 2 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas Huntington's disease is a progressive degenerative
- 4 neurological disease affecting 41,000 Americans while another
- 5 200,000 are genetically "at risk" of inheriting the expanded gene
- 6 responsible for causing the disease; and
- 7 Whereas, Each child of a parent with Huntington's disease has
- 8 a 50 percent chance of inheriting the Huntington's disease gene;
- 9 and
- 10 Whereas, Huntington's disease typically occurs in mid-life,

- 1 between the ages of 30 and 50, though onset has been known to occur
- 2 in children as young as 2 years of age; and
- 3 Whereas, The average lifespan after onset of Huntington's
- 4 disease is 10-20 years, and the younger the age of onset, the more
- 5 rapid the progression of the disease, resulting in children who
- 6 develop the juvenile form of the disease rarely living to
- 7 adulthood; and
- 8 Whereas, Since the discovery of the gene that causes
- 9 Huntington's disease in 1993, the pace of HD research has
- 10 accelerated. Scientists across the nation are conducting important
- 11 research into Huntington's Disease, which at present has no
- 12 effective treatment or cure; and
- 13 Whereas, It is critical to the success of research and support
- 14 services to raise awareness in the general public and the medical
- 15 community about Huntington's disease; now, therefore, be it
- 16 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 17 this legislative body declare May 2022 as Huntington's Disease
- 18 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. We encourage all citizens
- 19 to join in the observance.
