HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.313

Reps. Roth, Allor, Rogers, Markkanen, Borton, Cherry, Maddock, Bezotte, Garza, Glanville, Haadsma, Hood, Morse, Sabo, Sneller, Steenland and Young offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare June 4-11, 2022, as Boating and
- 2 Fishing Week in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Michigan is home to more than 800,000 registered
- 4 boats and an estimated 600,000 non-registered canoes and kayaks.
- 5 Michigan is also home to an estimated 4 million boating
- 6 enthusiasts, and
- 7 Whereas, Michigan ranks third nationally in boating
- 8 registration and ranks as the third largest boating market in the
- 9 country; and
- 10 Whereas, Recreational boating has an annual \$7.8 billion
- 11 impact on the state's economy and the boating industry provides

- 1 more than 58,000 jobs in Michigan; and
- 2 Whereas, In Michigan, recreational boaters are never farther

- 3 than 6 miles from a lake or stream. Michigan has 11,037 inland
- 4 lakes and ponds and 36,350 miles of rivers and streams; and
- 5 Whereas, Michigan has 1,300 public access sites, more than
- 6 1000 marinas, and 80 Harbors of Refuge available for boaters to
- 7 launch and or store their vessels; and
- 8 Whereas, Michigan has 3,288 miles of Great Lakes shoreline
- 9 which exceeds that of the United States Atlantic general coastline
- 10 of 2,069 miles; and
- 11 Whereas, Michigan's Harbors program provides that boaters are
- 12 never more than 30 miles from a safe harbor when boating Michigan's
- 13 Great Lakes shoreline; and
- 14 Whereas, Michigan's varied water surfaces are home to 154
- 15 species of fish which enhance the incredible range of freshwater
- 16 boating experiences for all types and sizes of recreational
- 17 watercraft; and
- 18 Whereas, Fifty percent of all boating activity is fishing-
- 19 related. Boating and fishing are recreational activities open to
- 20 individuals of any age and agility; and
- 21 Whereas, Boating and fishing offer a safe, outdoor,
- 22 recreational opportunity to commune with nature, destress, and
- 23 spend quality time with friends and family making memories that
- 24 last a lifetime; and
- 25 Whereas, Michigan Boating and Fishing Week is an opportunity
- 26 for government to join forces with recreational boating
- 27 associations, businesses, manufacturers, groups, organizations,
- 28 clubs and citizens to promote boating and the abundance of
- 29 freshwater resources Michigan has to offer its citizens and

- 2 Whereas, 2022 celebrates the 75th anniversary of the Michigan
- 3 State Waterways Commission and is to be honored by celebrating the
- 4 deep connection between Michigan's maritime history and a
- 5 commitment to the sustainability of the natural resources now and
- 6 into the future; now, therefore, be it
- 7 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 8 this legislative body declare June 4-11, 2022, as Boating and
- 9 Fishing Week in the state of Michigan.
