HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.327

Reps. Breen, Bollin, Tyrone Carter, Haadsma, Hertel, Hope, Kuppa, Liberati, Morse, Sneller, Steenland, Thanedar, Witwer and Young offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare July 2022 as Cleft and Craniofacial
- 2 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Cleft lip and cleft palate are birth defects that
- 4 occur when a baby's lip or mouth do not form properly before birth.
- 5 Together, these birth defects commonly are called "orofacial
- 6 clefts" or "oral clefts" (OFCs). Affecting 1-2 per 1,000 newborns,
- 7 together they are among the more common birth defects and the most
- 8 common affecting the face; and
- **9** Whereas, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
- 10 recently estimated that each year 2,651 babies in the United States

- 1 are born with a cleft palate and 4,437 babies are born with a cleft
- 2 lip (with or without a cleft palate); and
- 3 Whereas, In Michigan, from 1992 to 2010, the incidence of OFC
- 4 was about 1 in 637 live births (15.7 cases per 10,000 live births)
- 5 with an average number of 75 cases of cleft palate and 130 cases of
- 6 cleft lip (with or without cleft palate) each year; and
- 7 Whereas, These birth defects happen early during pregnancy, by
- 8 5 to 6 weeks after conception for cleft lip and by about 10 weeks
- 9 after conception for cleft palate. A baby can have a cleft lip, a
- 10 cleft palate, or both. A cleft may affect one side of the lip
- 11 and/or palate (unilateral) or both sides (bilateral) and may
- 12 disrupt the formation of the nose and/or extend into the gum or
- 13 upper jawbone; and
- 14 Whereas, Without proper medical intervention, the quality of
- 15 life of these newborn children are negatively impacted. Children
- 16 with orofacial clefts often have problems with feeding and talking.
- 17 They might also have ear infections, hearing loss, and problems
- 18 with their teeth. These children usually require one or more
- 19 surgeries early in life, as well as special feeding techniques,
- 20 orthodontic care and/or speech therapy. Severity varies with the
- 21 degree of clefting and with the presence of other birth defects.
- 22 In extreme cases, death may result; and
- 23 Whereas, Children who can have their orofacial clefts treated
- 24 are better positioned to live healthy and productive lives in the
- 25 same manner as children who are not born with clefts; now,
- 26 therefore, be it
- 27 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 28 this legislative body declare July 2022 as Cleft and Craniofacial
- 29 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. We encourage increased

- 1 awareness and recognition to these birth defects and those who live
- 2 with them.
