HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.352

Reps. Bolden, Breen, Cherry, Clemente, Garza, Haadsma, Hope, Kuppa, Liberati, Manoogian, Morse, Rabhi, Rogers, Sneller, Steenland, Stone and Weiss offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare October 2022 as Uterine Fibroids
- 2 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas Fibroids may cause significant morbidity through
- 4 their presence in the uterus and pelvic cavity, causing significant
- 5 pelvic pain, abnormal uterine bleeding, reproductive dysfunction,
- 6 miscarriages, and even infertility; and
- 7 Whereas, The pain, discomfort, stress, and other physical and
- 8 emotional symptoms of living with fibroids may significantly
- 9 interfere with a woman's quality of life, compromising her ability
- 10 to function normal, work, or care for her family, and may lead to

- 1 more severe health and wellness issues; and
- 2 Whereas, Uterine fibroids are the most prevalent medical
- 3 condition affecting women, with an estimated 30 percent of women
- 4 developing a uterine fibroid by age 35 and 80 percent of women
- 5 developing a uterine fibroid by age 50; and
- 6 Whereas, The exact number of affected women is unknown, as
- 7 early detection and diagnosis are difficult because only 1 out of 4
- 8 women who have uterine fibroid exhibit symptoms severe enough to
- 9 require treatment; and
- 10 Whereas, The overall incidence of uterine fibroids is
- 11 estimated to disproportionately impact Black and Hispanic women,
- 12 who also experience more severe symptoms, resulting in an incidence
- 13 rate that is 3 times greater in women with Black ancestry and 2
- 14 times greater in Hispanic women compared to Caucasian women; and
- 15 Whereas, A hysterectomy, or removal of the uterus, is among
- 16 the most common surgical treatments for uterine fibroids. More than
- 17 200,000 hysterectomies are performed each year to treat uterine
- 18 fibroids, at an estimated annual cost of more than \$2,000,000,000;

- 20 Whereas, Uterine fibroids have been estimated to cost the
- 21 United States \$5,900,000 to \$34,400,000,000 annually with an
- 22 estimated annual lost work cost of \$1,600,000,000 to
- 23 \$17,200,000,000 through absenteeism and short-term disability in
- **24** women ages 25 to 54; and
- Whereas, Public awareness and education campaigns on uterine
- 26 fibroids prevention, screening, and symptoms are held during the
- 27 month of September each year; now, therefore, be it
- 28 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 29 this legislative body declare October 2022 as Uterine Fibroids

- 1 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. We recognize the
- 2 disparity in incidence rates for Black and Hispanic uterine fibroid
- 3 patients and urge greater research, treatment, and care options
- 4 regarding uterine leiomyoma.
