## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.385

The Speaker, on behalf of the entire membership of the House of Representatives, offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution of tribute for the Honorable Annette Glenn.

2 Whereas, It is with gratitude that we recognize Representative

3 Annette Glenn for her work on behalf of the citizens of Michigan

4 and, in particular, her constituents in the Ninety-eighth District.

5 Throughout her tenure in the House, Representative Glenn's hard

6 work has benefited not only the people in Bay and Midland counties,

7 but all of Michigan's citizens; and

8 Whereas, Prior to joining the Legislature, Representative

9 Glenn showed a deep commitment to public service. She holds a

10 bachelor's degree in public administration from Boise State

11 University. She served in multiple legislative offices at both a

12 state and federal level, including as a former Congressional staff

- 1 member in the United States House of Representatives.
- 2 Representative Glenn also managed campaigns for the state Supreme
- 3 Court, Lieutenant Governor, and the state House and Senate.
- 4 Representative Glenn served her community as a volunteer with the
- 5 Boy Scouts of America and as treasurer for the Midland Fleet Feet
- 6 track team, the Midland Flames basketball team, and the Kairos
- 7 Debate Club. She is or has been a member of the Auburn Lions Club;
- 8 American Legion Auxiliary, Midland and Bay City post; and of the
- 9 Midland, Pinconning-Linwood, and Sanford Chambers of Commerce;
- 10 while also being an associate member of the Midland Blue Star
- 11 Mothers chapter. Representative Glenn is also a dedicated wife,
- 12 proud mother of five children, and grandmother to nine
- 13 grandchildren; and
- 14 Whereas, Since her election to the House of Representatives in
- 15 2018, Representative Glenn has demonstrated a deep and tireless
- 16 commitment to improving the lives of her constituents in the
- 17 Ninety-eighth District. She has served in a position of political
- 18 and community leadership during one of the most challenging periods
- 19 in the region's history, as her constituents in Midland and Sanford
- 20 suffered the effects of both the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic and the
- 21 evacuation of over 11,000 individuals during the catastrophic
- 22 flooding that followed the failure of the Edenville and Sanford
- 23 dams. Representative Glenn was also nominated for House Member of
- 24 the Year by the Michigan Information and News Service in
- 25 recognition of her efforts during the flood recovery, including
- 26 hand-delivering to Vice President Mike Pence an appeal for a
- 27 federal disaster declaration for her flood-ravaged communities; and
- 28 Whereas, Representative Glenn served with distinction as the
- 29 chair of the Appropriations subcommittees on Environment, Great

- 1 Lakes, and Energy and Military and Veterans Affairs and State
- 2 Police. She also served as the vice chair of the Appropriations
- 3 subcommittees on Licensing and Regulatory Affairs and Insurance and
- 4 Financial Services, Natural Resources and Environmental Quality,
- 5 and School Aid and Department of Education. Representative Glenn
- 6 also served as a member of the Appropriations Committee and the
- 7 Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services. She also
- 8 crafted several new state laws that include advocating for parental
- 9 rights in schools and improving services for military veterans.
- 10 Representative Glenn's dedication and integrity stand as a clear
- 11 example of hard work, public service, and strong leadership; now,
- 12 therefore, be it
- 13 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we offer this
- 14 expression of tribute to commend and thank the Honorable Annette
- 15 Glenn for her notable contributions to this legislative body and to
- 16 our state; and be it further
- 17 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 18 Representative Glenn as evidence of our appreciation and best
- 19 wishes.
