SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 86

1	A resolution to condemn the U.S. Department of Justice
2	memorandum on intimidation and harassment against school board
3	members for inhibiting parents' constitutional right to free speech
4	and to urge the State Board of Education to refrain from
5	participating in any actions that will further limit that right.
6	Whereas, On October 4, 2021, the U.S. Attorney General
7	released a memorandum directed at employees of the Department of
8	Justice (DOJ) concerning threats against school administrators,
9	board members, teachers, and school staff across the country. The
10	memo cites an increase in "harassment, intimidation, and threats of
11	violence" and calls for the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)
12	to coordinate with local law enforcement to facilitate a discussion
13	of strategies for addressing and responding to these threats; and
14	Whereas, While there is no debate regarding the need to

1 protect public servants from all credible threats of violence, the

- 2 vague language used in the memo is likely to obstruct another
- 3 vitally important public interest the freedom of speech. It is
- 4 unclear what types of speech may be considered to be "intimidation"
- 5 or "harassment," and the uncertainty is likely to have a chilling
- 6 effect on school board participation. Parents with legitimate
- 7 concerns about school issues may be hesitant to passionately
- 8 advocate for their children under the threat of federal
- 9 intervention; and
- 10 Whereas, The memo also sends an insulting message that
- 11 inaccurately characterizes the concerns of many parents. The memo
- 12 implies that parents who oppose a particular agenda are expected to
- 13 be violent and that federal intervention is needed to protect
- 14 others from their viewpoints. This type of statement demonizes
- 15 invested parents who share the goal of educating students and
- 16 protecting them from harmful policies. The associated stigma will
- 17 further impede the ability of parents to voice their concerns; now,
- 18 therefore, be it
- 19 Resolved by the Senate, That we condemn the October 4, 2021
- 20 U.S. Department of Justice memorandum for inhibiting parents'
- 21 constitutional right to free speech; and be it further
- 22 Resolved, That we call on the State Board of Education to
- 23 refrain from participating in any actions that will further limit
- 24 the First Amendment rights of parents and encourage local districts
- 25 to do the same; and be it further
- 26 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 27 U.S. Attorney General and the State Superintendent of Public
- 28 Instruction.
