SENATE RESOLUTION NO.103

Senators LaSata, Lauwers, Wozniak, Daley, Wojno, Bizon, Horn, Huizenga, Barrett, MacDonald, Johnson, Theis, Hertel, VanderWall, Schmidt and Stamas offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize January 30-February 5, 2022, as 2 Catholic Schools Week.
- 3 Whereas, There are 47,842 students attending 215 Catholic
- 4 elementary and high schools throughout our great state; and
- 5 Whereas, The Constitution of Michigan states that, "Religion,
- 6 morality and knowledge being necessary to good government and the
- 7 happiness of mankind, schools and the means of education shall
- 8 forever be encouraged"; and
- 9 Whereas, Catholic school parents pay tuition in addition to
- 10 supporting their local public schools through their taxes; and

- Whereas, Catholic schools comply with the same health, safety, 1 2 and general welfare regulations required of public schools; and Whereas, Taking into account Michigan's minimum public school 3 foundation allowance of \$8,700 per pupil, Catholic schools save 4 5 taxpayers more than \$416 million in state spending annually; and 6 Whereas, Catholic schools instill a broad, values-based 7 education, emphasizing the lifelong development of moral, 8 intellectual, and social values in young people, making them 9 responsible citizens of our state and nation; and 10 Whereas, Catholic schools educate many students who are non-11 Catholic and economically disadvantaged, identifying that a good education remains the single best way out of poverty; and 12 Whereas, With traditionally high academic standards, high 13 14 graduation rates, and commitment to community service, Catholic 15 schools and their graduates make a positive contribution to 16 society; and Whereas, January 30-February 5, 2022, has been designated as 17 Catholic Schools Week, with the theme "Catholic Schools: Faith. 18 Excellence. Service." as denoted by the National Catholic 19 Educational Association and the United States Conference of 20 21 Catholic Bishops; and 22 Whereas, The common good of the state of Michigan is 23 strengthened through the continued existence of Catholic schools; 24 and 25 Whereas, Catholic schools are committed to producing graduates who hold community service and "helping others" among their core 26 27 values; and
- Whereas, Catholic schools create a supportive partnership with each student's family, while also encouraging parental involvement

- 2 productive lives that benefit future generations; now, therefore,
- 3 be it
- 4 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 5 body recognize January 30-February 5, 2022, as Catholic Schools

- 7 Resolved, That we support the continued dedication of Catholic
- 8 schools across Michigan toward academic excellence and the key role
- 9 Catholic schools play in promoting and ensuring a brighter,
- 10 stronger future for students; and be it further
