- 9 primary, preventive, early intervention, and mental health services

- 2 suburban schools across the state; and
- 3 Whereas, Children and youth served by school-based and school-
- 4 linked health centers show improved rates of school attendance,
- 5 enhanced scores on standardized tests, less absenteeism due to
- 6 illness, and increased immunization rates, while having their
- 7 wellness and health care needs addressed; and
- 8 Whereas, School-Based Health Care Awareness Month acknowledges
- 9 the commitment and passion that school-based and school-linked
- 10 health center staff and parents/quardians have for all Michigan
- 11 children and youth; and
- 12 Whereas, We also recognize the critical role that these
- 13 individuals play in improving the health and well-being of all
- 14 Michigan children and youth; now, therefore, be it
- 15 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 16 body recognize February 2022 as School-Based Health Care Awareness
