- 3 Whereas, The House of Representatives recognizes the
- 4 anniversary of the United States Supreme Court decision, Roe v.
- 5 Wade, decided on January 22, 1973. This ruling affirmed that the
- 6 Constitution of the United States safeguards the right to make
- 7 personal medical decisions and that government should not intrude;

Whereas, Reproductive freedom is vital to health, economic 1 security, and the ability to participate equally in society; and 2 Whereas, Comprehensive reproductive health care, including 3 safe abortion, is a vital component of overall health; and 4 5 Whereas, Like other medical procedures, the safety of abortion 6 is furthered by evidence-based practices developed and supported by 7 medical professionals; and 8 Whereas, Any regulation of medical care should be grounded in 9 scientific evidence and improve health outcomes; and 10 Whereas, In the landmark decision Whole Woman's Health v. 11 Hellerstedt, the United States Supreme Court recently reaffirmed the constitutional right to access safe, legal abortion, confirming 12 13 more than 40 years of precedent; and 14 Whereas, One in three people will need an abortion in their 15 lifetime. As such, safe, legal, and accessible abortion is an essential component of comprehensive reproductive health care; and 16 Whereas, Everyone should have access to comprehensive health 17 18 care in the state of Michigan. The right to access safe, legal abortion is a right in name only for many citizens. State imposed 19 20 restrictions keep abortion out of reach for many- particularly 21 those who have been systemically and historically marginalized, such as Black and Brown communities and those with low incomes; 22 23 now, therefore, be it Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 24 25 this legislative body recognize the 48th anniversary of the 26 issuance of the U.S. Supreme Court Roe v. Wade ruling. We denounce 27 violence towards abortion providers and their patients; and be it
