HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.125

Reps. Alexander and Lightner offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution to declare June 9, 2021, as 102nd United States 2 Colored Troops Day in the state of Michigan. 3 Whereas, The 102nd United States Colored Troops honorably and 4 courageously served the United States and the state of Michigan during the Civil War; and 5 Whereas, The 102nd United States Colored Troops was Michigan's 6 7 only black regiment in the war. Many of its soldiers were former 8 slaves who had escaped to freedom; and 9 Whereas, The unit was formed in 1863 as the First Michigan Colored Infantry Regiment. Although Michigan's white regiments 10 retained their state designation, the First Michigan Colored 11 12 Infantry was renamed the 102nd United States Colored Troops when it 13 began federal service in 1864; and

Whereas, The men of the 102nd United States Colored Troops and 1 other black regiments served nobly despite the disparate treatment 2 they received compared to white regiments. White soldiers were 3 provided with enlistment bonuses, higher pay, and better equipment, 4 5 while white officers were appointed to command black units; and 6 Whereas, Black regiments were generally assigned non-combat 7 duties, such as the construction of fortifications or the destruction of Confederate railroads, but the 102nd United States 8 9 Colored Troops also fought bravely in battle when opportunities 10 arose; and 11 Whereas, The soldiers of the 102nd United States Colored Troops put their lives on the line to save the Union, an effort 12 that ushered in the ratification of the Thirteenth Amendment to the 13 14 United States Constitution and the abolition of legalized slavery 15 across the nation; and Whereas, Michigan's Governor and Legislature unanimously 16 17 recognized the 102nd United States Colored Troops with the 18 enactment of Public Act 494 of 2014, which designated the portion 19 of Interstate 375 within Wayne County as the "102nd United States 20 Colored Troops (U.S.C.T.) Memorial Highway" in honor of the 21 regiment; and 22 Whereas, The state of Michigan preserves battle flags carried 23 by Michigan troops, including flags used by the 102nd United States Colored Troops. Flag replicas are displayed in the state Capitol 24 25 rotunda; and Whereas, A prominent young citizen of Jackson, Michigan, has 26 27 led fundraising efforts for the installation of signs denoting the

102nd United States Colored Troops Memorial Highway, as well as for

conservation and a replica of a battle flag presented to the 102nd
