HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.178

Rep. Bolden offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution to declare October 2021 as Uterine Fibroids 2 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. Whereas Fibroids may cause significant morbidity through 3 their presence in the uterus and pelvic cavity, causing significant 4 pelvic pain, abnormal uterine bleeding, reproductive dysfunction, 5 6 miscarriages, and even infertility; and 7 Whereas, The pain, discomfort, stress, and other physical and 8 emotional symptoms of living with fibroids may significantly interfere with a woman's quality of life, compromising her ability 9 to function normal, work, or care for her family and may lead to 10 more severe health and wellness issues; and 11 Whereas, Uterine fibroids are the most prevalent medical 12

- 1 condition affecting women, with an estimated 30 percent of women
- 2 developing a uterine fibroid by age 35 and 80 percent of women
- 3 developing a uterine fibroid by age 50; and
- 4 Whereas, The exact number of affected women is unknown, as
- 5 early detection and diagnosis are difficult because only 1 out of 4
- 6 women who have uterine fibroid exhibit symptoms severe enough to
- 7 require treatment; and
- 8 Whereas, The overall incidence of uterine fibroids is
- 9 estimated to disproportionately impact Black and Hispanic women,
- 10 who also experience more severe symptoms, resulting in an incidence
- 11 rate that is 3 times greater in women with Black ancestry and 2
- 12 times greater in Hispanic women compared to Caucasian women; and
- 13 Whereas, A hysterectomy, or removal of the uterus, is among
- 14 the most common surgical treatments for uterine fibroids. More than
- 15 200,000 hysterectomies are performed each year to treat uterine
- 16 fibroids, at an estimated annual cost of more than \$2,000,000,000;

- 18 Whereas, Uterine fibroids have been estimated to cost the
- 19 United States \$5,900,000 to \$34,400,000,000 annually with an
- 20 estimated annual lost work cost of \$1,600,000,000 to
- 21 \$17,200,000,000 through absenteeism and short-term disability in
- **22** women ages 25 to 54; and
- 23 Whereas, Public awareness and education campaigns on uterine
- 24 fibroids prevention, screening, and symptoms are held during the
- 25 month of September each year; now, therefore, be it
- 26 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 27 this legislative body declare October 2021 as Uterine Fibroids
- 28 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. We recognize the
- 29 disparity in incidence rates for Black and Hispanic uterine fibroid

- 1 patients and urge greater research, treatment, and care options
- 2 regarding uterine leiomyoma.
