A resolution to create a House select committee to examine the actions of Lee Chatfield, former Representative of the One-hundred Seventh House District.

Whereas, Article XI, Section 1 of the Constitution of the State of Michigan of 1963 provides, in relevant part:

All officers, legislative, executive and judicial, before entering upon the duties of their respective offices, shall take and subscribe the following oath or affirmation: I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support the Constitution of the United States and the constitution of this state, and that I will faithfully discharge the duties

of the office of according to the best of my 1 2 ability... 3 ; and 4 Whereas, Rule 74(4) of the Standing Rules of the House of 5 Representatives states: 6 A Member shall not convert for personal, business and/or 7 campaign use, unrelated to House business, any supplies, 8 services, facilities, or staff provided by the State of 9 Michigan. This includes, but is not limited to, telephones, 10 telecopy machines, computers, postage, and copy machines. 11 ; and 12 Whereas, Confidence in government and elected officials is a prerequisite to the functioning of a democratic society; now, 13 14 therefore, be it 15 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That a House select 16 committee to examine the actions of Lee Chatfield is created. The 17 select committee shall consist of six members. Three members of the 18 select committee shall be from the House Republican Caucus selected 19 by the Speaker of the House and three members of the select 20 committee shall be from the House Democratic Caucus selected by the 21 House Minority Leader. The Speaker of the House and the House 22 Minority Leader shall each designate a co-chair of the select 23 committee. The House select committee shall report its findings and 24 recommendations to the House of Representatives; and be it further 25 Resolved, That the House select committee may subpoena 26 witnesses, administer oaths, and examine the books, records, and 27 tapes of any person, partnership, association, or corporation, 28 public or private, involved in a matter properly before the 29 committee; may call upon the services and personnel of any agency
