SENATE RESOLUTION NO.19

Senators Polehanki, Moss, Bayer, Wojno, Alexander, Hertel and Brinks offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to designate March 1, 2021, as COVID-19 Victims 2 and Survivors Memorial Day.

Whereas, SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) is an illness caused by a virus
that can transmit from person-to-person and has spread across the
world, creating a global pandemic and having catastrophic effects

on human life, our communities, and our economy; and

7 Whereas, In response to the rapid spread of COVID-19 and 8 recent stay-at-home orders, essential workers have stepped up to 9 provide critical services in order to help protect our communities 10 and save lives, while sacrificing their own health and safety; and

11 Whereas, COVID-19 has had a disproportionate impact on low-

- 1 income communities and communities of color, exacerbating the
- 2 inequities already prevalent in our systems, and has further
- 3 exposed how racism and classism are America's most dangerous
- 4 preexisting conditions; and
- 5 Whereas, The symptoms and severity of COVID-19 can vary
- 6 dramatically by individuals and the long-term health implications
- 7 for survivors is largely unknown, as many survivors suffer from
- 8 lingering side effects of the disease; and
- 9 Whereas, As of February 23, 2021, more than 2.48 million
- 10 people worldwide and 500,000 people in the United States have lost
- 11 their lives due to COVID-19, and, in Michigan alone, more than
- 12 15,362 lives have been lost to this deadly virus; and
- 13 Whereas, Each life lost to COVID-19 matters and leaves a hole
- 14 in the hearts of loved ones, family members, and surrounding
- 15 communities; and
- 16 Whereas, Public health guidance and policies targeted at
- 17 prevention such as social distancing, wearing masks in public, and
- 18 staying home help mitigate the spread of COVID-19, prevent illness,
- 19 and lessen the burden on individuals and society; now, therefore,
- **20** be it
- 21 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 22 body designate March 1, 2021, as COVID-19 Victims and Survivors
- 23 Memorial Day; and be it further
- 24 Resolved, That we urge local residents to continue to take
- 25 preventative measures, including social distancing and following
- 26 public health orders, to mitigate the spread of this virus; and be
- 27 it further
- 28 Resolved, That this resolution pay tribute to essential
- 29 workers and those who rose in service to protect the public.
