## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.28

Senators Bayer, Irwin, Wojno, Polehanki, Brinks, Chang and Hollier offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to urge the Senate of the United States to pass,

2 and the President of the United States to sign, legislation to ban

3 chokeholds, end racial and religious profiling, establish a

national database to track police misconduct, and prohibit certain

5 no-knock warrants, among other initiatives.

6 Whereas, The death of George Floyd in May 2020 triggered

7 nationwide protests and national outcry against police brutality.

8 The killings of Americans, especially people of color, have again

9 focused attention on police misconduct. These incidents create

10 instability within our communities and require police reforms at

11 all levels; and

12 Whereas, Necessary first steps to address police brutality and

- 1 misconduct include banning the use of chokeholds, prohibiting
- 2 certain no-knock warrants, and creating a national registry of
- 3 police misconduct to stop the cycling in and out of officers who
- 4 have poor disciplinary records or histories of abuse; and
- 5 Whereas, The George Floyd Justice in Policing Act of 2021,
- 6 H.R. 434, recently passed by the U.S. House of Representatives,
- 7 addresses racial and religious profiling, bans chokeholds and no-
- 8 knock warrants, holds police accountable for misconduct in court,
- 9 and provides for investigations into police misconduct. The George
- 10 Floyd Justice in Policing Act of 2021 is an appropriate first step
- 11 in reforming police practices to protect the rights of all
- 12 Americans; now, therefore, be it
- 13 Resolved by the Senate, That we urge the Senate of the United
- 14 States to pass, and the President of the United States to sign,
- 15 legislation to ban chokeholds, end racial and religious profiling,
- 16 establish a national database to track police misconduct, and
- 17 prohibit certain no-knock warrants, among other policing reforms;
- 18 and be it further
- 19 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 20 President of the United States, the President of the United States
- 21 Senate, and members of the Michigan congressional delegation.
