## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.83

Senator Theis offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to condemn President Joe Biden's authoritarian
- 2 decision to impose vaccine requirements on private employers.
- 3 Whereas, On September 9, 2021, President Joe Biden announced
- 4 his administration's plan to impose strict COVID-19 vaccine
- 5 requirements on private businesses. Employers with over 100
- 6 employees will be required to ensure employees are vaccinated or
- 7 impose burdensome weekly testing regimens. The President also moved
- 8 to mandate vaccines for health care workers, federal contractors,
- 9 and the majority of federal workers; and
- 10 Whereas, These requirements are an egregious overreach by the
- 11 President infringing on Americans' civil liberties. Health care
- 12 decisions, including whether or not to get vaccinated, are deeply
- 13 personal and should not be subject to intrusive and autocratic

- 1 edicts from the government; and
- 2 Whereas, Imposing vaccine requirements will disproportionately

- 3 impact low-income Americans. People in households with an annual
- 4 income of less than \$25,000 make up the largest share of
- 5 unvaccinated Americans. Imposing sanctions, such as lost
- 6 employment, on the most economically vulnerable is unnecessarily
- 7 cruel; and
- 8 Whereas, The President's exemption for U.S. postal workers
- 9 from vaccine requirements highlights the political calculations
- 10 behind the policy. Exempting these federal employees while imposing
- 11 vaccines and onerous testing requirements on private sector
- 12 employees undermines the assertion that the policy is about
- 13 defeating COVID-19; and
- 14 Whereas, President Biden's dictate is not grounded in science
- 15 and does not address the significant COVID-19 protections acquired
- 16 by natural immunity. Any policy ignoring science in favor of
- 17 oppressive mandates reveals the true purpose of that policy is
- 18 control rather than public health. This directive serves no public
- 19 health purpose and will result in resistance, not compliance; now,
- 20 therefore, be it
- 21 Resolved by the Senate, That we condemn President Joe Biden's
- 22 authoritarian decision to impose vaccine requirements on private
- 23 employers; and be it further
- 24 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 25 President of the United States.
