Senator Stamas offered the following resolution:

A resolution to designate October 2021 as Michigan Library

Appreciation Month.

Whereas, The Michigan Library Association (MLA) annually

designates the month of October as a statewide observance to

celebrate the contributions of Michigan's libraries, librarians,

and library staff; and

Whereas, Michigan's libraries, including school, public,

academic, tribal, and special libraries, are vital institutions and

dynamic centers of discovery, lifelong learning, and serve as

cornerstones in healthy communities; and

Whereas, Librarians and library workers play key roles in

helping people explore, imagine, and discover new horizons in the

- 2 Whereas, Today's libraries are less about what they have on
- 3 the shelves and more about what they can do with and for their
- 4 communities, whether it's through virtual services or in-person
- 5 visits; and
- 6 Whereas, Libraries and librarians work to create an equitable
- 7 society by providing free access to accurate information for all
- 8 people; and
- 9 Whereas, In times of crisis, libraries and library staff play
- 10 a critical role in continuing to support their communities when
- 11 they need it the most; and
- 12 Whereas, Libraries bring together diverse populations and are
- 13 a resource for all members within their communities regardless of
- 14 race, ethnicity, creed, ability, sexual orientation, gender
- 15 identity, or socio-economic status; and
- 16 Whereas, The development and maintenance of programs and
- 17 collections in libraries are as diverse as the populations they
- 18 serve; and
- 19 Whereas, Libraries serve as a vital connection to the people,
- 20 places, and ideas of the world through books, magazines, videos,
- 21 and the internet and are the primary point of online access for
- 22 people without computers at home, school, or work; and
- 23 Whereas, Indispensable educational resources for children and
- 24 teenagers are provided by libraries, which are on the front lines
- 25 in the battle against illiteracy, offer plenty of free activities,
- 26 as well as safe, enriching entertainment for the whole family; and
- 27 Whereas, Half of all Michiganders hold library cards and visit
- 28 their local libraries in-person more than 43 million times
- 29 annually, online nearly 50 million times annually, and borrow

- 1 nearly 40 million items each year; and
- 2 Whereas, In 2020, Michigan public libraries provided more than
- 3 13,000 live virtual programs for children, teens, and adults
- 4 reaching over 608,000 people; and
- 5 Whereas, Additionally, during the worldwide pandemic, 76
- 6 percent of Michigan's public libraries offered curbside services
- 7 and 82 percent continued to provide reference services via phone
- 8 and internet which provided a way for residents to get information
- 9 and materials even when library buildings were closed to the
- 10 public; and
- 11 Whereas, Hundreds of libraries and millions of library
- 12 supporters across Michigan are celebrating Michigan Library
- 13 Appreciation Month this October; now, therefore, be it
- 14 Resolved by the Senate, That members of this legislative body
- 15 designate October 2021 as Michigan Library Appreciation Month.
- 16 During this time, we encourage all residents to visit their
- 17 library's website to explore and discover its wide variety of
- 18 services, resources, and collections.
