SENATE RESOLUTION NO.86

Senators Theis, Runestad, Victory, McBroom, Outman, Barrett, LaSata, Daley, Johnson, VanderWall, Bumstead, Bizon and Schmidt offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to condemn the U.S. Department of Justice
- 2 memorandum on intimidation and harassment against school board
- 3 members for inhibiting parents' constitutional right to free
- 4 speech.
- 5 Whereas, On October 4, 2021, the U.S. Attorney General
- 6 released a memorandum directed at employees of the Department of
- 7 Justice (DOJ) concerning threats against school administrators,
- 8 board members, teachers, and school staff across the country. The
- 9 memo cites an increase in "harassment, intimidation, and threats of
- 10 violence" and calls for the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)
- 11 to coordinate with local law enforcement to facilitate a discussion

1 of strategies for addressing and responding to these threats; and

- 2 Whereas, While there is no debate regarding the need to
- 3 protect public servants from all credible threats of violence, the
- 4 vague language used in the memo is likely to obstruct another
- 5 vitally important public interest the freedom of speech. It is
- 6 unclear what types of speech may be considered to be "intimidation"
- 7 or "harassment," and the uncertainty is likely to have a chilling
- 8 effect on school board participation. Parents with legitimate
- 9 concerns about school issues may be hesitant to passionately
- 10 advocate for their children under the threat of federal
- 11 intervention; and
- 12 Whereas, The memo also sends an insulting message that
- 13 inaccurately characterizes the concerns of many parents. The memo
- 14 implies that parents who oppose a particular agenda are expected to
- 15 be violent and that federal intervention is needed to protect
- 16 others from their viewpoints. This type of statement demonizes
- 17 invested parents who share the goal of educating students and
- 18 protecting them from harmful policies. The associated stigma will
- 19 further impede the ability of parents to voice their concerns; now,
- 20 therefore, be it
- 21 Resolved by the Senate, That we condemn the October 4, 2021
- 22 U.S. Department of Justice memorandum for inhibiting parents'
- 23 constitutional right to free speech; and be it further
- 24 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 25 U.S. Attorney General.
