SENATE RESOLUTION NO.91

Senator Runestad offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution to recognize the historic, cultural, and 2 religious significance of the festival of Diwali. 3 Whereas, Diwali is celebrated annually every autumn by Hindus, Sikhs, and Jains in Michigan, the United States, and throughout the 4 world, with over one billion celebrants marking the holiday; and 5 Whereas, Diwali is a holy day, during which celebrants light 6 7 small oil lamps and place them around the home. The lighting of the 8 lamps is followed by prayers for attainment of health, wealth, knowledge, peace, and valor, and is recognized as the beginning of 9 a new year for some Hindus; and 10 Whereas, "Diwali" is a shortened version of the Sanskrit word 11 12 "Deepavali", which means a row of lamps, and in English is referred

- 1 to as the "festival of lights;" and
- 2 Whereas, Celebrants of Diwali believe that the rows of lamps
- 3 symbolize the light within the individual that rids the soul of the
- 4 darkness of ignorance; and
- 5 Whereas, For Hindus, Diwali is a celebration of the belief
- 6 that light triumphs over darkness and good triumphs over evil; and
- 7 Whereas, For Sikhs, Diwali is feted as the day that the sixth
- 8 founding Sikh Guru, or revered teacher, Guru Hargobind, was
- 9 released from captivity by the Mughal Emperor Jehangir; and
- 10 Whereas, For Jains, Diwali marks the anniversary of the
- 11 attainment of moksha or liberation by Lord Mahavira, the last of
- 12 the Tirthankaras, who were the great teachers of Jain Dharma at the
- 13 end of his life in 527 B.C.; and
- 14 Whereas, Michigan remains resolute in its commitment to
- 15 continue fostering diversity of experience and religious
- 16 acceptance; and
- 17 Whereas, Diwali is a time marked by qualities of togetherness,
- 18 family, and community; now, therefore, be it
- 19 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 20 body recognize the historic, cultural, and religious significance
- 21 of the festival of Diwali. We recognize the Diwali message of
- 22 tolerance, compassion, and acceptance of others which resonates
- 23 with the ideals of the American spirit; and be it further
- 24 Resolved, That we express respect and admiration to all those
- 25 who celebrate Diwali throughout the world and in our own
- 26 communities.
