SENATE RESOLUTION NO.154

Senator Runestad offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to urge the Congress of the United States to
- 2 permanently extend the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 with
- 3 commensurate spending cuts to avoid increasing the federal tax
- 4 burden.
- 5 Whereas, Prior to government-mandated economic shutdowns
- 6 during the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017
- 7 (TCJA) spurred steady economic expansion and allowed the spirit of
- 8 entrepreneurship to flourish, while creating new jobs and
- 9 opportunities for tens of millions of Americans. The act resulted
- 10 in a \$1.5 trillion net tax cut, and was followed by historically
- 11 low unemployment rates, an increase in business investment, and a
- 12 \$6,000 increase in real median household income over the next two
- 13 years. This includes scores of raises and bonuses for workers

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- 1 immediately after the law was adopted; and
- 2 Whereas, The TCJA reduced federal tax rates for households
- 3 across every income level, and this relief resulted in a tax cut of
- 4 more than \$1,500 for the average middle-income earner. The act had
- 5 many provisions to reduce the individual income taxes including
- 6 reductions in personal income tax rates, nearly doubling the
- 7 standard deduction, and substantially reducing the hated
- 8 Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT); and
- 9 Whereas, The TCJA set an annual cap of \$10,000 on the state
- 10 and local tax (SALT) deduction, broadening the tax base at the
- 11 federal level and in many states. This caused state level budget
- 12 surpluses and lead to many states offering substantial tax relief;

- 14 Whereas, Prior to the TCJA, the top corporate income tax rate
- 15 in the United States was thirty-five percent, the highest among all
- 16 nations in the Organization for Economic Co-operation and
- 17 Development (OECD). The act reduced the tax rate to twenty-one
- 18 percent, bringing the United States back to average among OECD
- 19 member nations, and dramatically enhancing American
- 20 competitiveness; and
- 21 Whereas, Many significant provisions of the TCJA are set to
- 22 expire after December 31, 2025. Allowing these provisions to expire
- 23 would result in a massive federal tax increase on hardworking
- 24 American taxpayers, a significant decline in American
- 25 competitiveness, fewer jobs, reduced wage income for workers, and
- 26 higher prices. In addition, the expiration of these provisions
- 27 would incentivize many states to return to a period of higher taxes
- 28 and inflated spending; and
- Whereas, More than 100 million American taxpayers from all

- 1 income groups, but especially those in the middle and working
- 2 classes, have enjoyed real tax relief due to the TCJA. The majority
- 3 of Americans support making these tax cuts permanent; now,
- 4 therefore, be it
- 5 Resolved by the Senate, That we urge the Congress of the
- 6 United States to permanently extend the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of
- 7 2017 with commensurate spending cuts to avoid increasing the
- 8 federal tax burden; and be it further
- 9 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 10 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the
- 11 President of the United States Senate, and the members of the
- 12 Michigan congressional delegation.
