SENATE RESOLUTION NO.165

Senator Runestad offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to condemn the federal government's expansion of 2 the Internal Revenue Service through the Inflation Reduction Act of
- **3** 2022.
- 4 Whereas, In early August of 2022, the Federal Bureau of
- 5 Investigation (FBI) conducted an invasive raid of the private
- 6 residence of former President Donald Trump at his Mar-a-Lago resort
- 7 in Florida. While this was an unprecedented action taken by the
- 8 federal government, it is no coincidence that it came at the same
- 9 time legislators in Washington, D.C. were seriously contemplating
- 10 and acting on the passage of the Inflation Reduction Act, which
- 11 opens the door for more invasive, unprecedented, and un-American
- 12 interference by the federal government into the lives of private
- 13 citizens; and

Whereas, The Inflation Reduction Act will allow nearly five 1 hundred billion dollars in new spending by our federal government 2 over the next decade, with almost eighty billion dollars being 3 directed to the Internal Revenue Service's (IRS) budget. The budget 4 5 allocations of this law spell out the current Administration's big-6 government intentions for the future of the IRS. Over forty-five 7 billion dollars will be directed to "enforcement" while a meager 8 three billion is expected to be used for "taxpayer services." As 9 part of these budgetary expansions, the IRS would hire eighty-seven 10 thousand new employees, making this agency larger than the FBI, 11 Pentagon, State Department, and Border Patrol combined. This Act is not intended to benefit Americans - it is just the latest 12 development in this Administration's police state agenda; and 13 14 Whereas, A 2017 report by the Treasury Inspector General for 15 Tax Administration found that the IRS's Criminal Investigation 16 Division repeatedly violated the civil rights of Americans under 17 the guise of enforcing tax laws and seizing taxpayer property. 18 Michiganders are right to fear a massive budget expansion for a tax 19 collection agency that feels it necessary to undermine the rights 20 of our citizens in pursuit of collecting their hard-earned money with little to no restraint; and 21 22 Whereas, In 1974, then-President Gerald Ford warned Congress 23 that "[a] government big enough to give you everything you want is a government big enough to take from you everything you have." This 24 25 Administration represents just the latest installment in a halfcentury long tradition of paying no heed to past generations' 26 27 commonsense understanding that government should play a minimal role in our lives. As the only President who was a fellow 28 29 Michigander, it is appropriate for our citizens to take seriously

- 1 President Ford's warning and strongly condemn this massive
- 2 expansion of a federal agency that only exists by virtue of our
- 3 collective tax dollars. The Inflation Reduction Act would hand over
- 4 tens of billions of dollars to create an IRS big enough and well-
- 5 armed enough to take whatever it wants from our citizens whenever
- 6 it pleases; now, therefore, be it
- 7 Resolved by the Senate, That we condemn the expansion of the
- 8 Internal Revenue Service through the Inflation Reduction Act of
- 9 2022; and be it further
- 10 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 11 President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States
- 12 House of Representatives, the President of the United States
- 13 Senate, and the members of the Michigan congressional delegation.
