- Sec. 31ff. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated under section 11, \$250,000,000.00 is appropriated for 2023-2024 from the state school aid fund to eligible districts and eligible intermediate districts for the purposes described in this section.
 - (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, to
