THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 471. Petitions under section 2 of article XII of the
- 2 state constitution of 1963 proposing an amendment to the
- 3 constitution must be filed with the secretary of state at least $\frac{120}{120}$
- 4 160 days before the election at which the proposed amendment is to

- 1 be voted upon. on. Initiative petitions under section 9 of article
- 2 II of the state constitution of 1963 must be filed with the
- 3 secretary of state at least $\frac{160}{200}$ days before the election at
- 4 which the proposed law would appear on the ballot if the
- 5 legislature rejects or fails to enact the proposed law. Referendum
- 6 petitions under section 9 of article II of the state constitution
- 7 of 1963 must be filed with the secretary of state not more than 90
- 8 days following the final adjournment of the legislative session at
- 9 which the law that is the subject of the referendum was enacted.
- 10 Not more than 15% of the signatures to be used to determine the
- 11 validity of a petition described in this section shall be of
- 12 registered electors from any 1 congressional district. Any
- 13 signature submitted on a petition above the limit described in this
- 14 section must not be counted. When filing a petition described in
- 15 this section with the secretary of state, a person must sort the
- 16 petition so that the petition signatures are categorized by
- 17 congressional district. In addition, when filing a petition
- 18 described in this section with the secretary of state, the person
- 19 who files the petition must state in writing a good-faith estimate
- 20 of the number of petition signatures from each congressional
- 21 district. the petitioner must state in writing that the petitioner
- 22 has made a good-faith effort to sort the petitions based on the
- 23 number of signatures contained on each petition sheet and that the
- 24 petitioner is submitting at least the minimum number of required
- 25 petition signatures.
